

DEUTERONOMY

1014. Deuteronomy 1:1-5 In the eleventh month, first day of 40th year out of Egypt, Moses speaks to Israel.
1015. Deuteronomy 1:6-8 Instructions to enter Canaan, to Lebanon across to the Euphrates River.
1016. Deuteronomy 1:9-18 Moses recaps how he appointed leaders and judges over Israel.
1017. Deuteronomy 1:19-25 Moses tells of Israel's travels and spying out Canaan.
1018. Deuteronomy 1:26-32 Moses repeats the story of the fears of enemies, giants, and unbelief in God's protection of Israel.
1019. Deuteronomy 1:33-39 God says that only children, Joshua, Caleb, and those who did not rebel may enter Canaan.
1020. Deuteronomy 1:40-46 Rebellious Israelites are turned back into the wilderness because repentance is too late.
1021. Deuteronomy 2:1-13 Moses talks of failures of Israel and of Esau and Lot's descendents in Canaan.
1022. Deuteronomy 2:14 All "over twenty" rebellious of Israel have died during the first 38 years into the exodus.
1023. Deuteronomy 2:16-19 Israel is given marching orders; they are to leave Ammon alone because it is Lot's inheritance.
1024. Deuteronomy 2:20-21 Giants (Zamzummims) dwelled in but were run out of the land given to the Ammonites.
1025. Deuteronomy 2:24-33 God sends fear and resistance all over Canaan because Israel is coming; Israel wins the battles.
1026. Deuteronomy 2:34-37 Israel kills all in King Sihon's Heshbon, even women and children (Amorites).

1027. Deuteronomy 3:1-10 King Og's Amorite kingdom is taken and the cities of the plains, Gilead, etc.
1028. Deuteronomy 3:11 King Og of Bashan (Amorite) is a giant; his bedstead is made of iron, its size is 9 by 4 cubits.
1029. Deuteronomy 3:13 Bashan is called "The Land of Giants."
1030. Deuteronomy 3:14-17 Recap of land given to the Reubenites, Gadites, and Half Tribe of Manasseh.
1031. Deuteronomy 3:18-20 God tells Israel to leave their wives and children in the safe cities and then to advance against the enemy.
1032. Deuteronomy 3:21-25 God's instructions to Joshua to take Canaan (+V28).
1033. Deuteronomy 3:26-29 God orders Moses to view Canaan from top of Mt. Pisgah but he can not go in.
1034. Deuteronomy 4:1-2 God tells Moses that Israel may not change or diminish His Commandments.
1035. Deuteronomy 4:3-20 Moses again recaps Israel's problems, journeys, the 10 Commandments arrival, etc.
1036. Deuteronomy 4:21-22 Moses tells Israel that he must die for his sins and will not be permitted to go "over Jordan."
1037. Deuteronomy 4:23-26 Moses predicts Israel's fall to idols and warns them.
1038. Deuteronomy 4:27 Moses prophesies that Israel will be "scattered among the nations."
1039. Deuteronomy 4:28-31 Merciful God will reunite ancient Israel if they turn back to Him (Israel returned to Palestine in 1948).
1040. Deuteronomy 4:32-40 God tells of choosing Israel (Jews) and miracles He did for them.

1041. Deuteronomy 4:41-43 Moses names the Cities Of Refuge for the east side of the Jordan River: Bezer, Ramoth, and Golan.
1042. Deuteronomy 4:44-49 Moses recaps Israel's possessions on the east side of the Jordan River.
1043. Deuteronomy 5:1-21 Moses reviews God's covenant with Israel and amplifies the 10 Commandments.
1044. Deuteronomy 5:22-33 Moses speaks of God talking from fire to Israel and His demands.
1045. Deuteronomy 6:1-5 God instructs Israel on their conduct and loving Him completely.
1046. Deuteronomy 6:7 God demands family devotion and teaching the Bible in every activity.
1047. Deuteronomy 6:8 God wants Bible verses worn on the hand and hung between the eyes (phylactery).
1048. Deuteronomy 6:9 God wants Bible verses painted on posts of homes and on the gates.
1049. Deuteronomy 6:11-12 God fears that prepared cities, wells, and fields, simply for the takeover, will spoil Israel.
1050. Deuteronomy 6:13-25 God's instructions for Israel's conduct in Canaan and in the teaching of their history.
1051. Deuteronomy 7:1 God says that the nations of Hittites, Girgashites, Amorites, Canaanites, Perizzites, Hivites, and Jebusites must be killed or run out of Canaanland (The Promised Land).
1052. Deuteronomy 7:2-3 Israel must utterly destroy the countries and kingdoms of Canaan, without mercy, no covenants or marriages may be made with them.
1053. Deuteronomy 7:4-6 Israel must destroy Canaan's gods, images, groves, etc., because Israel is a holy people.

1054. Deuteronomy 7:7-8 God's reason for choosing Israel as His people, His promise to Abraham, etc.
1055. Deuteronomy 7:9 God promises to keep His covenant and mercy with Israel for 1,000 generations if they obey Him.

LENGTH OF A GENERATION AT THIS TIME IS 65.642 YEARS – A THOUSAND MORE GENERATIONS WOULD INCREASE THE EARTH'S AGE BY 65,642 YEARS – ADDED TO THE EARTH'S AGE AT THAT TIME WOULD PLACE IT AT 68,348 YEARS TOTAL TO ACCOMMODATE GOD'S PROMISE.

1056. Deuteronomy 7:10 God will destroy all enemies of Israel face to face.
1057. Deuteronomy 7:11-14 God's promised love and blessings to Israel; He promises no person or animal will be barren.
1058. Deuteronomy 7:15 God promises no sickness or diseases if Israel (and we) obey Him.
1059. Deuteronomy 7:16-19 God tells Israel not to fear being outnumbered by their enemies, He promises victory.
1060. Deuteronomy 7:20 God says He will send hornets to destroy Israel's enemies.
1061. Deuteronomy 7:21-26 Israel must destroy even an enemy's names; they may keep no enemy jewelry or any "cursed thing."
1062. Deuteronomy 8:2 Reason for 40 years in the wilderness was to prove Israel could live by God's commandments.
1063. Deuteronomy 8:3 Manna was fed to Israel to show and "know that man doth not live by bread alone, but by the Word..."
1064. Deuteronomy 8:4 Israelis' clothes and shoes never grew old, apparently expanded with their growth.
1065. Deuteronomy 8:5-8 God instructs on discipline and the bounty of food in Canaanland.

1066. Deuteronomy 8:9 God calls Canaan “Land of Iron Stones” – iron and brass were plentiful in Canaan.
1067. Deuteronomy 8:10-16 God tells Israel to not forget where all of their blessings came from.
1068. Deuteronomy 8:17-20 God says if Israel thinks they got their blessings by themselves and forgets Him, He will destroy them.
1069. Deuteronomy 9:1 Moses addresses Israel on the coming day of crossing the Jordan River into Canaan.
1070. Deuteronomy 9:2 Moses says Israel will face Anak giants in Canaan.
1071. Deuteronomy 9:3-6 God says He will defeat Canaan because they are more unrighteous than Israel.
1072. Deuteronomy 9:7-9 Moses recalls to Israel their evil and his 40-day fast on Mt Sinai getting the 10 Commandments.
1073. Deuteronomy 9:10-12 God wrote the 10 Commandments with His finger and sent the tablets down to Israel.
1074. Deuteronomy 9:13-18 Moses descends Mt. Sinai, sees the golden calf that Aaron made and Israel is worshipping, falls on his face, and fasts for another 40 days (This makes a total of 80 days fasting for Moses).
1075. Deuteronomy 9:19-20 Moses succeeds in saving the people of Israel and Aaron from death.
1076. Deuteronomy 9:21-29 Moses talks of Israel’s rebellion all during his life, but God saves them.
1077. Deuteronomy 10:1-5 Moses tells of building the Ark of the Covenant and God writing the Second 10 Commandments.
1078. Deuteronomy 10:6-7 Recap of Israel’s journeys, Aaron’s death, and Eleazar becoming Chief Priest.

1079. Deuteronomy 10:8-9 Levites separated out of Israel to carry the Ark; they have no inheritance.
1080. Deuteronomy 10:10 Moses upon Mt. Sinai for the second 40 days and nights getting the new 10 Commandments.
1081. Deuteronomy 10:11-14 God says Israel is to fear Him, serve Him, love Him, and obey Him because He (God) owns everything.
1082. Deuteronomy 10:15-17 God speaks of choosing Israel as his chosen people, instructs that they must have “circumcised hearts,” and that He regards not persons (no favorites).
1083. Deuteronomy 10:18-19 God loves strangers; says Israelis were once strangers in Egypt.
1084. Deuteronomy 10:22 Seventy, (70) Israelis went into Egypt during the famine and are now multiplied like the stars.
1085. Deuteronomy 11:1-12 God gives “Pep Talk” to Israel about Egypt, the Exodus, and preparation for Canaan.
1086. Deuteronomy 11:13-17 If Israel will obey God and serve Him, He will bless them.
1087. Deuteronomy 11:18-21 A repeat of Phylacteries on hands and head, doorposts and gates, and instructions to teach continuously.
1088. Deuteronomy 11:21 Obedience to God will bring days of “Heaven upon the Earth.”
1089. Deuteronomy 11:22-25 God will drive out all other nations of Canaan; all land stepped on will belong to Israel.
1090. Deuteronomy 11:24 All land will belong to Israel from the Euphrates River to the Mediterranean Sea.
1091. Deuteronomy 11:26-32 Blessings and curses promised to Israel for good or bad conduct.

1092.	Deuteronomy 12:1-3	Israel is commanded to destroy all idols, groves, and images of Canaan.
1093.	Deuteronomy 12:4-15	God previews Israel's duties of worship and offerings in Canaan.
1094.	Deuteronomy 12:16	Israel is prohibited from eating blood (Kosher preparation) (+V23).
1095.	Deuteronomy 12:17	Law against consuming items meant for tithes or offerings.
1096.	Deuteronomy 12:19	Israel is ordered not to forsake the Levites (+14:27).
1097.	Deuteronomy 12:29-31	Israel ordered to not follow any customs of their enemies nor inquire of their gods.
1098.	Deuteronomy 13:1-5	Death to false prophets or dreamers among Israelites suggesting other gods.
1099.	Deuteronomy 13:6-11	If a member of an Israeli family tries to lead any of them to other gods, the family and others are to stone him.
1100.	Deuteronomy 13:12-18	If Belial worshippers pollute a whole city, that city, its entire people, and all goods will be destroyed.
1101.	Deuteronomy 13:17	God's word on "The Cursed Thing" – booty kept by Israel taken from the enemy.
1102.	Deuteronomy 14:1	No carving of human flesh for decoration nor shaving between the eyes for the dead.
1103.	Deuteronomy 14:2-8	Clean and unclean animals for food (V8-no pork allowed).
1104.	Deuteronomy 14:9-20	Edible fish and fowl for Israelites.
1105.	Deuteronomy 14:21	An Israeli cannot eat an animal which dies of itself but may give it to a stranger or sell it to an alien.
1106.	Deuteronomy 14:21	Israel is forbidden from seething a kid killed for food in his mother's milk.

1107. Deuteronomy 14:22-26 Tithing and eating or selling the food tithe.
1108. Deuteronomy 14:29 Levites, strangers, fatherless, and widows may come and eat an Israeli's food tithe.
1109. Deuteronomy 15:1-4 Creditors released from debts after 7 years (exception if the creditor is rich).
1110. Deuteronomy 15:6 Israel may lend to other nations but never borrow; it may reign over other nations but not be ruled over.
1111. Deuteronomy 15:7-11 We are ordered to give to the poor wholeheartedly because the poor will always be with us.
1112. Deuteronomy 15:12-14 Second use of the word "Hebrew" (Exodus 2:11-12) – A Hebrew sold to another Hebrew must be released on the 7th year with goods.
1113. Deuteronomy 15:16-18 If a bought servant (Hebrew or other) wants to stay with the owner, an awl must be thrust through his or her ear.
1114. Deuteronomy 15:19-23 First animal males sanctified cannot be worked or sheared.
1115. Deuteronomy 16:1 Month Abib is sanctified for Passover, Israel's first celebration (Exodus from Egypt).
1116. Deuteronomy 16:2-8 Unleavened bread (bread of affliction) is eaten for 7 days only at designated place.
1117. Deuteronomy 16:9-12 Feast of Weeks, Israel's second celebration is observed 7 weeks from the beginning of harvest.
1118. Deuteronomy 16:13-15 Feast of Tabernacles, Israel's third celebration is observed 7 days after the end of harvest.
1119. Deuteronomy 16:16-17 All male Israelites must appear before God at all three observances.
1120. Deuteronomy 16:18-20 Appointing Judges in Israel and God's demand for their good conduct.

1121. Deuteronomy 16:21-22 No planting of groves or setting up any image near God's altar.
1122. Deuteronomy 17:1 No blemished or evil flavored animal may be sacrificed.
1123. Deuteronomy 17:2-7 One who has wrought wickedness in Israel must be stoned if there are 2 or 3 witnesses.
1124. Deuteronomy 17:8-13 Matters going to Judges, Priests, or Levites receive judgment that must be obeyed or penalty of death.
1125. Deuteronomy 17:14-20 Provisions for a King over Israel and requirement for good conduct of a King.
1126. Deuteronomy 18:1-8 Levites with no inheritance must receive their upkeep from each tribe of Israel.
1127. Deuteronomy 18:9-14 Israel is to avoid all abominations and wizards, etc. of Canaan heathen nations.
1128. Deuteronomy 18:15-22 First mention of God sending Prophets, their required conduct, and false prophets.
1129. Deuteronomy 19:1-10 Setting aside 3 "Refuge Cities" in Canaan; three more to be added later.
1130. Deuteronomy 19:11-13 Handling of premeditated murderers in Israel.
1131. Deuteronomy 19:14 Prohibition from moving or removing landmarks in Israel.
1132. Deuteronomy 19:15-20 More than one witness required for a committed crime; penalty and judgment of false witnesses.
1133. Deuteronomy 19:21 No pity is allowed for criminal; life for life, eye for eye, tooth for tooth, hand for hand, and foot for foot.
1134. Deuteronomy 20:1-4 Prior to the Israeli battle, priest will brief and God will handle larger enemies.

1135. Deuteronomy 20:5-7 Deferment from military service for new wife, new house, or new vineyard.
1136. Deuteronomy 20:8 The fearful and fainthearted are eliminated from military service because they might scare others.
1137. Deuteronomy 20:9 Appointment of Captains of armies to lead.
1138. Deuteronomy 20:10-11 If an enemy accepts peace, it may be spared for servant duty.
1139. Deuteronomy 20:12-15 All males in enemy cities are killed; women, children, and goods may be taken.
1140. Deuteronomy 20:16-18 In inheritance cities Israel is to kill all that breathe, Hittites, Amorites, Canaanites, Perizzites, Hivites, and Jebusites.
1141. Deuteronomy 20:19-20 Do not destroy enemy food trees; build bulwarks against enemy cities to subdue them.
1142. Deuteronomy 21:1-9 If a dead person is found in a field, nearest city must have a special ceremony for the deceased.
1143. Deuteronomy 21:10-14 Taking a captured woman for a wife – Procedures.
1144. Deuteronomy 21:15-17 Inheritance of a first son even though born to a hated wife.
1145. Deuteronomy 21:18-21 Rebellious, gluttonous, drunkard, disobedient son may be stoned by Israel’s elders.
1146. Deuteronomy 21:22-23 A hanged criminal must be cut down and buried on the same day of death.
1147. Deuteronomy 22:1-3 Law on returning a lost animal or lost property to an Israeli brother.
1148. Deuteronomy 22:4 An Israeli must help a brother raise up a fallen animal.
1149. Deuteronomy 22:5 Abomination for “cross dressing” – woman in man’s clothing or a man in woman’s clothing.

1150. Deuteronomy 22:6-7 A bird on a nest may not be taken but young birds in the nest may be taken.
1151. Deuteronomy 22:8 A new house building must have a battlement (barrier) so that the roofer won't fall.
1152. Deuteronomy 22:9 Sowing must be with pure seed, not divers seeds.
1153. Deuteronomy 22:10 Prohibition against plowing mixed animals, i.e. ox with a donkey, etc.
1154. Deuteronomy 22:11 Israelis are prohibited from wearing mixed material clothing, wool with linen, etc.
1155. Deuteronomy 22:12 Fringes must be sewn on 4 corners of vesture – outer garment.
1156. Deuteronomy 22:13-21 Treatment of a virgin and a non-virgin wife.
1157. Deuteronomy 22:22-24 Death penalty for adultery.
1158. Deuteronomy 22:25-27 Death for man only who forces sex on a married woman in an Israeli country.
1159. Deuteronomy 22:28-29 A man forcing sex on a virgin must pay her father and marry her.
1160. Deuteronomy 22:30 A man may not take his father's wife nor see his father naked.
1161. Deuteronomy 23:1 A man with destroyed testicles or severed penis is exiled.
1162. Deuteronomy 23:2 A bastard child is exiled from the congregation of Israel for ten generations
1163. Deuteronomy 23:3-6 Prohibition against Ammonite or Moabite (Lot's descendants) from entering the congregation.
1164. Deuteronomy 23:7-8 Edomite is a brother; Egyptian must wait three generations to enter the congregation of Israel.

1165. Deuteronomy 23:10-12 If a man messes his pants, he must leave the camp, wash himself, and come back into camp after dark.
1166. Deuteronomy 23:13 One must have a paddle on his weapon to dig a hole for stool and to cover it.
1167. Deuteronomy 23:14 The Israeli camp must be kept absolutely clean for God to walk through.
1168. Deuteronomy 23:15-16 If a servant escapes and comes to you, he must not be returned to his master.
1169. Deuteronomy 23:17 Whores and homosexuals are prohibited from Israel.
1170. Deuteronomy 23:18 Whore money and selling a dog is an abomination to God.
1171. Deuteronomy 23:19-20 No lending of money or property for usury to a brother; it is allowed to a stranger.
1172. Deuteronomy 23:21-23 Vows of payment to God must be paid.
1173. Deuteronomy 23:24 One may eat from his neighbor's vineyard but may not carry fruit out of the vineyard.
1174. Deuteronomy 23:25 One may eat plucked corn in neighbor's field but no sickle may be used.
1175. Deuteronomy 24:1-4 Divorce is allowed for uncleanness; wife may remarry, but may never remarry her first husband.
1176. Deuteronomy 24:5 A newlywed husband is free from war and business for one year.
1177. Deuteronomy 24:6 Neither of two millstones may be taken as a pledge if they are used for making a living.
1178. Deuteronomy 24:7 Death penalty for kidnapping and selling an Israelite.
1179. Deuteronomy 24:8-9 Law on handling Leprosy; priest involvement and exile.

1180. Deuteronomy 24:10-13 One may not enter a debtor's home to collect a debt and cannot keep debtor's garment pledge over night.
1181. Deuteronomy 24:14-15 One must pay a poor servant on the date his pay is due; it is a sin to delay or withhold payment.
1182. Deuteronomy 24:16 A parent may not be put to death for a child's crime or a child for a parent's crime.
1183. Deuteronomy 24:17-18 There may be no perversion of judgment against a stranger, fatherless, or widow.
1184. Deuteronomy 24:19-22 A farmer must leave a part of his harvest for the poor.
1185. Deuteronomy 25:1-3 In judgment the wicked must lose; in a penalty of beating by the court, only 40 stripes may be administered.
1186. Deuteronomy 25:4 One must not muzzle an ox plowing corn but he must be allowed to eat freely.
1187. Deuteronomy 25:5 In a family living together, a brother must marry his dead brother's wife.
1188. Deuteronomy 25:6 In such a union, the firstborn (girl or boy) must be named for the dead brother.
1189. Deuteronomy 25:7-10 If a man refuses to marry his brother's widow she may loosen his shoe before the elders and spit in his face.
1190. Deuteronomy 25:11-12 A woman's hand is cut off if she grabs the privates of a man fighting her husband.
1191. Deuteronomy 25:13-16 Law on accurate weights and measures; it is an abomination if such is in error.
1192. Deuteronomy 25:17-19 Remembrance of Amalek's attack on Israel upon Israel's exodus from Egypt.
1193. Deuteronomy 26:1-4 The first fruit of Canaan must be brought to the priest and taken to the altar.

1194. Deuteronomy 26:5 Israelites were Syrians who went down into Egypt.
1195. Deuteronomy 26:6-11 Recounting Israel's bondage in Egypt, the exodus, and offering of their first fruits in Canaan.
1196. Deuteronomy 26:12-15 The third year is a year of tithing, giving to the poor, and declaration to God.
1197. Deuteronomy 26:16-19 Review of God's statutes and Israel's vow to keep them and serve Him.
1198. Deuteronomy 27:1-8 Upon crossing the Jordan River at Ebal, Israel is required to set up stones, plaster them and paint the Law thereon.
1199. Deuteronomy 27:5-6 An altar is built there on whole stones not touched by tools.
1200. Deuteronomy 27:9-13 Blessing and cursing groups must each shout from two mountains.
1201. Deuteronomy 27:14-26 Levites must yell all curses against sin and the people must then yell "Amen!"
1202. Deuteronomy 28:1-14 Blessings await Israel if they live for God and if so, they will be a number one nation.
1203. Deuteronomy 28:15-48 Curses on Israel if it does not obey God – like U.S.A.
1204. Deuteronomy 28:49-52 God tells of Babylonian captivity and punishment coming in Israel's future.
1205. Deuteronomy 28:53-55 In a siege, Israeli parents will eat their children and will not share their children's flesh with others.
1206. Deuteronomy 28:56-57 Tender and delicate wives will eat their newborn babies.
1207. Deuteronomy 28:58-63 Even more punishment and plagues will be on Israel if it doesn't follow God.

1208. Deuteronomy 28:64-68 God says Jews shall be dispersed all over the world and shipped through Egypt again.
1209. Deuteronomy 29:1-29 God's covenant with Israel is amplified; again, they will wear the same clothes and shoes for 40 years.
1210. Deuteronomy 30:1-20 God's dealings with Israel in dispersing and gathering them; their blessings and cursings.
1211. Deuteronomy 31:1-6 Moses is 120 years old; his mission is finished; he speaks and appoints Joshua to lead Israel.

EARTH AGE IS 2,706 YEARS + 2 MONTHS AND 23 DAYS

1212. Deuteronomy 31:7-8 Moses' charge to Joshua in leading Israel into Canaanland.
1213. Deuteronomy 31:9-13 Moses writes and delivers the LAWS to Levite priests; they are read at the feast to Israel.
1214. Deuteronomy 31:14-18 God calls Moses and Joshua together, He talks through a cloud and says Israel will be bad.
1215. Deuteronomy 31:19-22 God has Moses write and teach a "Song of Failure" to Israel.
1216. Deuteronomy 31:24-26 Moses writes the "BOOK OF LAW," places it inside the ARK with the stone tablets.
1217. Deuteronomy 31:27-30 Moses gathers the elders and officers of Israel; he tells them of Israel's future corruption.
1218. Deuteronomy 32:1-43 Moses preaches a sermon to Israel of their past and future calamities.
1219. Deuteronomy 32:44-45 Moses ends the "Song of Failure," Hoshea, son of Nun and brother to Joshua is with him.
1220. Deuteronomy 32:48-52 God tells Moses to climb Mt. Nebo in Moab, view Canaan, and die.

1221. Deuteronomy 33:1-29 Moses' blessing of Israel before his death, he speaks of each tribe of Israel.
1222. Deuteronomy 34:1-4 God takes Moses to Mt. Pisgah (on Mt. Nebo) to view Canaan.
1223. Deuteronomy 34:5-6 Moses dies and is buried by God in a valley in Moab by Bethpeor placed in a secret location.
1224. Deuteronomy 34:7 Moses dies at 120 years old with good eyesight and health.

EARTH AGE IS 2,706 YEARS + TWO MONTHS AND 23 DAYS

1225. Deuteronomy 34:8 Israel weeps for 30 days over Moses' death in the Plains of Moab.
1226. Deuteronomy 34:9 Joshua is full of the spirit of wisdom because Moses had laid hands upon him.
1227. Deuteronomy 34:10 God says there was never a prophet in Israel like Moses.
1228. Deuteronomy 34:10 God knew Moses "face to face."
1229. Deuteronomy 34:11-12 Signs and wonders of Moses in Egypt and before Israel.
