

EXODUS

403. Exodus 1:1-6 Generations of Israel (Jacob); there are 70 including wife and sons of Joseph.
404. Exodus 1:7 Children of Israel become fruitful, multiply and fill Egypt.
405. Exodus 1:8-10 New King (Pharaoh) of Egypt afraid, because there are so many Israelites, that they may join enemy forces in case of war.
406. Exodus 1:11 Pharaoh enslaves Israelites, makes them build Pithom and Raamses cities.
407. Exodus 1:12-14 The more affliction, the more Israelis multiply; Pharaoh is more afraid.
408. Exodus 1:15-16 Pharaoh instructs midwives, Shiphrah and Puah to kill all Israelite boys at birth.
409. Exodus 1:17-19 Pharaoh learns that midwives are not killing Israeli boys; they tell him that Israeli women deliver faster than Egyptian women and have their babies before midwives can birth and kill them.
410. Exodus 1:20-21 Midwives fear God; birthing houses are built for them.
411. Exodus 1:22 Pharaoh orders that all male Israelite babies be cast into the river.
412. Exodus 2:1-4 Moses' Levite parents birth him and hide him in an ark; his sister watches over him. Moses is their third child.
413. Exodus 2:5-6 Pharaoh's daughter sees Moses, rescues him.
414. Exodus 2:7-9 Miriam, Moses' sister, asks Pharaoh's daughter about a nurse for him; she is sent and gets Moses' mother for a wet nurse.
415. Exodus 2:10 Moses' mother returns him to Pharaoh's daughter; she names him "Moses."

416. Exodus 2:11-12 Moses is grown, sees an Egyptian beating a Hebrew (first mention of this word in the Bible); Moses kills the Egyptian.
417. Exodus 2:13-14 Moses again breaks up a fight between two Hebrews; they reveal that he had killed an Egyptian.
418. Exodus 2:15 Pharaoh discovers killing, seeks to slay Moses; Moses flees to Midian (Sinai).
419. Exodus 2:16-20 Moses at Midian well, waters flocks of Priest Reuel's daughters.
420. Exodus 2:21-22 Moses is given Reuel's daughter, Zipporah, has a son, Gershom.
421. Exodus 2:23-25 Egyptian Pharaoh dies, Israelites are in bondage, cry out to God; God hears them.
422. Exodus 3:1 Moses' father-in-law has another name "Jethro." Moses takes flocks to Mt. Horeb.
423. Exodus 3:2-4 God appears to Moses in a burning bush on Mt. Horeb; the bush is not consumed.
424. Exodus 3:5 God tells Moses to take off his shoes; he is standing on holy ground.
425. Exodus 3:6-9 God speaks to Moses about the affliction of Israelites; He will deliver them to Canaan to the "Land Of Milk And Honey."
426. Exodus 3:10 God tells Moses he will be sent to Pharaoh to lead the children out of Egypt.
427. Exodus 3:11-12 Moses argues with God; God says Israelites will worship on Mt. Horeb.
428. Exodus 3:13-15 God tells Moses to speak to Israelites and to identify Him (God) as "I AM."
429. Exodus 3:16-18 Moses tells Pharaoh that he and the elders desire to go into the wilderness for three days to sacrifice.

430. Exodus 3:19-22 God says Pharaoh will refuse and be smitten; Israelis will take treasures of Egypt when they leave.
431. Exodus 4:1-5 Moses argues with God about his credentials; God changes his rod into a snake and then back into a rod.
432. Exodus 4:6-8 God turns Moses' hand leprous and then back to normal again; God says for Moses to use these two signs before Pharaoh.
433. Exodus 4:9 God says if Pharaoh will not believe; turn the river water to blood.
434. Exodus 4:10-17 Moses and God discuss his speech; pick Aaron to talk and Moses to be God's intermediary.
435. Exodus 4:18-21 Moses tells father-in-law Jethro about his mission, takes his wife and children and his rod to Egypt. Old Pharaoh is dead.
436. Exodus 4:22-23 God says tell Pharaoh "Israel is my Son, let him go!"
437. Exodus 4:24-26 God seeks to kill Moses at an inn; Moses' wife Zipporah circumcises their son, calls Moses "bloody."
438. Exodus 4:27-31 Aaron meets Moses; he is given the words to say and speaks them to the Elders of Israel.
439. Exodus 5:1-5 Moses and Aaron meet with Pharaoh who says, "I don't know God and will not let Israel go.
440. Exodus 5:6-23 Pharaoh makes Israelis get their own straw for bricks; Israeli officers are mad at Moses.
441. Exodus 6:1-9 God uses the name "Jehovah" (first time in Bible), says He will lead Israel to Canaan.
442. Exodus 6:10-13 God gives Moses and Aaron commission to override Pharaoh.

443. Exodus 6:14-19 Genealogies of Israel.
444. Exodus 6:20 Moses, Aaron and Miriam's father and mother identified.
445. Exodus 6:23 Aaron's wife and children.
446. Exodus 6:25 Aaron's son Eleazar's wife and family – heads of Fathers of Levites.
447. Exodus 7:1 God says Moses will be a god to Pharaoh.
448. Exodus 7:2-6 God says an Army of Israel will be coming out of Egypt.
449. Exodus 7:7 Moses is now 80 years old, Aaron is 83 years old and Miriam is probably 88 to 90 years old.
450. Exodus 7:8-14 God sends Moses and Aaron to do rod trick – Pharaoh's snakes eaten by Moses snakes (rod).
451. Exodus 7:15-25 Plague #1 – All waters in Egypt are turned to blood for 7 days (v25).
452. Exodus 8:1-7 Plague #2 – Frogs cover Egypt – Pharaoh's magicians can also do this.
453. Exodus 8:8-14 Pharaoh repents, says Israelis can leave; frogs died out and stank.
454. Exodus 8:15 Frogs are gone; Pharaoh changes his mind, Israelis refused permission to leave.
455. Exodus 8:16-18 Plague #3 – Lice cover Egypt, Pharaoh's magicians can not do this and say, "This is the Finger of God."
456. Exodus 8:19-24 Plague #4 – Pharaoh refuses again; Flies cover Egypt but none are in Goshen, home of Israelis.
457. Exodus 8:25-32 Moses and Pharaoh confer; Isrealis can leave, Pharaoh changes his mind again after flies depart.

458. Exodus 9:1-7 Plague #5 – All Egyptian cattle die except those belonging to Israel; Pharaoh still refuses to allow Israelis to leave.
459. Exodus 9:8-11 Plague # 6 – God has Moses and Aaron throw dust into the air; the dust causes boils to form on Egyptians’ skin.
460. Exodus 9:12-21 Pharaoh’s heart is hardened; God warns of coming hail; all must get indoors or die.
461. Exodus 9:22-26 Plague # 7 God rains hail and fire, it kills everyone outside; Pharaoh calls for Moses and Aaron.
462. Exodus 9:27-35 Pharaoh makes a deal to stop the hail; when it is stopped Pharaoh hardens his heart once again.
463. Exodus 10:1-19 Plague #8 – God sends locusts (grasshoppers) all over Egypt.
464. Exodus 10:20-29 Plague #9 – God sends darkness; Pharaoh says he will see Moses no more.
465. Exodus 11:1-2 God tells Moses to have Israelis borrow all silver, gold, and jewelry from the Egyptians.
466. Exodus 11:4-10 Moses tells of Gods plan to kill all firstborns of all men and animals of Egyptians.
467. Exodus 12:2 God begins Hebrew calendar – first month of the year.

EARTH AGE IS APPROXIMATELY 2,666 YEARS AT THIS TIME

468. Exodus 12:3-7 Tenth day Hebrews are to take lambs and on the fourteenth day must kill these lambs and apply their blood to their houses.
469. Exodus 12:8-11 Hebrews (Israelis) are to roast and eat the lambs, burn the excess, leaving none, and have their clothes and shoes on for departure.

470. Exodus 12:11-14 Passover starts; God tells what will happen and of future observances.
471. Exodus 12:18-20 Passover is seven-day observance; Hebrews must eat only unleavened bread; penalty if not observed.
472. Exodus 12:21-28 God gives specific instructions of Passover and of instructing future generations.
473. Exodus 12:29-32 Passover happens; there are deaths in every Egyptian home; Pharaoh tells Hebrews to go and to bless him.
474. Exodus 12:33-36 Hebrews spoil Egyptians by taking their wealth and depart.
475. Exodus 12:37 Numbers of Hebrews departing were 600,000 men plus their families (approximately three million); they travel from Rameses to Succoth on the first day.
476. Exodus 12:40 Hebrews have spent 430 years in Egypt.

EARTH AGE IS APPROXIMATELY 2,666 YEARS AT EXODUS

477. Exodus 12:43-44 No stranger may eat the Passover feast; servants may partake only after they have been circumcised (+ V48).
478. Exodus 12:46 No bones of the sheep baked and eaten are allowed to be broken.
479. Exodus 12:51 First day Hebrews come out of Egypt; they are called Hebrew "Armies" – It is the month "Abib" (13:4).
480. Exodus 13:2 God declares all firstborn males of the Hebrews and their animals are His (V12).
481. Exodus 13:5 God refers to Canaan as "Land flowing with milk and honey" (V16).
482. Exodus 13:9 Beginning of black boxes containing scriptures – Phalacteries, worn on hands and between the eyes of Hebrews.

483. Exodus 13:17 God leads Hebrews into wilderness to avoid Philistines and war.
484. Exodus 13:18 Hebrews are “harnessed” out of Egypt.
485. Exodus 13:19 Moses takes the bones of Joseph out of Egypt.
486. Exodus 13:20 Hebrews travel from Succoth to Etham in edge of the wilderness where they camp.
487. Exodus 13:21-22 God provides a pillar of cloud by day and a pillar of fire by night to guide the Hebrews.
488. Exodus 14:1-3 God tells Hebrews to camp in places near the sea so that Pharaoh will think they are out in the wilderness.
489. Exodus 14:4-6 God hardens Pharaoh’s heart against Hebrews; he makes plans to follow them.
490. Exodus 14:7-9 Pharaoh takes his army with all the chariots in Egypt and pursues the Hebrews to the sea at Pihahiroth by Baalzephon.
491. Exodus 14:10-12 Hebrews see Pharaoh’s armies approaching; they are afraid and mad at Moses for the exodus.
492. Exodus 14:13-15 Moses tells Hebrews to fear not and see the salvation of the Lord and their last look at Egyptians.
493. Exodus 14:16 God tells Moses how to part the waters of the sea with his rod.
494. Exodus 14:19-20 Pillars separate Egyptians from Hebrews night and day.
495. Exodus 14:21-23 Moses parts the sea, the Hebrews cross, and the Egyptians pursue.
496. Exodus 14:21-28 God causes breakdown of Egyptian chariots in midst of the sea passage, has Moses return the water, and all of the Egyptian Army drowns.

497. Exodus 14:29-31 Hebrews see the dead Egyptians, fear the Lord, and believe Moses.
498. Exodus 15:1-13 Moses and Hebrews make up a song about the deliverance – V4 “Red Sea.”
499. Exodus 15:14 Word “Palestina” first used; Canaan will be afraid of Hebrews.
500. Exodus 15:15 Dukes of Edom (Esau) and Moabites (Lot’s and daughter’s people) in Canaan will fear Hebrews (Israelites).
501. Exodus 15:20 Miriam is a prophetess (sister of Moses and Aaron); she and the Hebrew women dance with timbrels.
502. Exodus 15:22 Moses leads Israel (Hebrews) from out of the Red Sea and into the Wilderness of Shur.
503. Exodus 15:23-25 At Marah the water is bitter; God has Moses cast tree leaves into it and it becomes sweet.
504. Exodus 15-26 God promises Israel will have no diseases if they will follow Him.
505. Exodus 15:27 Hebrews come to Elim which has 12 wells and 70 palm trees.
506. Exodus 16:1 Israel comes to Wilderness of Sin between Elim and Sinai; they are one month and fifteen days out of Egypt.
507. Exodus 16:2-3 Israel rebels against Moses, have no food, and wish to be back in Egypt.
508. Exodus 16:4 God promises, “rain bread” (manna is not yet named) for Hebrews; He gives them the rules for gathering it.
509. Exodus 16:5-8 Moses and Aaron speak to Israel about murmurings against them and God.
510. Exodus 16:9-12 God appears in a cloud, speaks to Moses, and says He will send meat and bread.

511. Exodus 16:13-14 God sends quail in the evening for meat and morning “dew” – “small round thing.”
512. Exodus 16:15-18 “Manna” is first named; God gives gathering instructions (one omer per man) and all have plenty.
513. Exodus 16:19-20 Israel is ordered to consume all gathered food each day; food left until morning will have worms and stink; Moses becomes angry when they leave food.
514. Exodus 16:21-24 Sun melts the manna; Moses instructs Israel to bake and seethe extra food for the Sabbath; none can be gathered then.
515. Exodus 16:25-29 Some Israelites disobeyed, had no manna available for the Sabbath; they search for food; Moses is angry.
516. Exodus 16:30 Israelis rest on the Sabbath, ordered to do so by God.
517. Exodus 16:31 Manna is named; it is like coriander seed, white, and tastes like honey wafers.
518. Exodus 16:32-34 People are instructed by Moses to “fill an omer” to show to future generations.
519. Exodus 16:35-36 Israel eats manna for 40 years, Egypt to Canaan – an omer is 1/10th of an ephah.
520. Exodus 17:1 Israel moves from Wilderness of Sin to Rephidim; they are without water.
521. Exodus 17:2-7 Israel cries for water; God has Moses strike a rock in Horeb and water comes forth.
522. Exodus 17:7 The place is called Massah and Meribah “Is the Lord among us, or not” meaning to Israel.
523. Exodus 17:8-9 Amalek fights Israel at Rephidim; Moses orders Joshua (first mention of Joshua) and his men to fight Amalek.

524. Exodus 17:9-13 Hur and Aaron must hold up his arms as Moses is on an overlooking hill with his rod for victory, he sits on a stone.
525. Exodus 17:14 God has Moses write a memorial of the battle in a book; Moses rehearses it to Joshua.
526. Exodus 17:15-16 Moses builds an altar “Jeho-vah-nissi”; Israel will war with Amalek from generation to generation.
527. Exodus 18:1-12 Moses’ father-in-law brings his wife Zipporah and sons Gershom and Eliezer to him during the exodus.
528. Exodus 18:13:27 Jethro, Moses’ father-in-law helps him set up judges and court system in Israel because there is too much judging for Moses alone.
529. Exodus 19:1-2 Hebrews move from Rephidim to Wilderness of Sinai and camp by the mountain.
530. Exodus 19:3-9 God speaks great things for Hebrews; God says they will be “A Kingdom of Priests.”
531. Exodus 19:10-14 God has people wash their clothes, instructs them not to touch the mountain or they will die.
532. Exodus 19:15-25 God appears on Mt. Sinai with fire, clouds, and trumpets; orders that Aaron be brought to Him.
533. Exodus 20:1-21 God speaks the 10 Commandments to Israel directly.
534. Exodus 20:23 God restates that He will allow no gods of silver or gold (idols).
535. Exodus 20:24-26 God’s instructions for building an altar; no cut stones and no steps.
536. Exodus 21:2 God gives law of servants: 6 years of service and seventh year they are to be released.

537. Exodus 21:4 If a servant's master gives a wife to him, he may leave at the release time but the wife and children remain with the master as his property.
538. Exodus 21:5-6 If a servant wants to remain with his master past the release date, his ear must be bored through with an awl.
539. Exodus 21:7-8 Law of handling servants' daughters sexually, etc.
540. Exodus 21:9 A servant's daughter married to a master's son becomes the master's daughter.
541. Exodus 21:10-11 Law of additional wives, their duties, and rights – polygamy.
542. Exodus 21:12-14 Death penalty for murder – penalty for other type killings.
543. Exodus 21:15 Death penalty for striking father or mother (V17) death penalty for cursing them.
544. Exodus 21:16 Death penalty for stealing and selling a person.
545. Exodus 21:18-19 Law of assault, penalty; perpetrator must pay for lost time and medical treatment.
546. Exodus 21:22-23 Abortion law – death penalty for deliberate killing of an unborn child.
547. Exodus 21:24-25 Law for “an eye for an eye,” “tooth for a tooth,” “burning for burning,” and “wound for wound.”
548. Exodus 21:26-27 Law for releasing an injured servant.
549. Exodus 21:28-30 Death or money payment by owner for a domestic animal killing a person (+ V31, 32, 35, and 36).
550. Exodus 21:33-34 “Pit fall” law of hazardous property, holes left uncovered, etc.

551.	Exodus 22:1	Penalty for stealing; penalty of 5 to 1 for oxen and 4 to 1 for sheep.
552.	Exodus 22:2	Breaking and entering theft; killing of thief is legal.
553.	Exodus 22:3-4	Other laws of theft (+V7-15).
554.	Exodus 22:5-6	Law of destroying property of others and penalty.
555.	Exodus 22:16-17	Penalty for fornication, marry or pay money.
556.	Exodus 22:18	Death penalty for witches.
557.	Exodus 22:19	Bestiality (sex with an animal) requires the death penalty.
558.	Exodus 22:20	Death penalty for idol worship or sacrifice to another god.
559.	Exodus 22:21	Law prohibiting the bad treatment of strangers (+23:9).
560.	Exodus 22:22-24	Death penalty for affliction of a widow or fatherless child.
561.	Exodus 22:25	Usury is prohibited; no interest may be charged on a loan to a poor person.
562.	Exodus 22:26-27	Raiment (coat) taken for security must be returned by night to protect from the cold.
563.	Exodus 22:28	Law against reviling God or cursing rulers in authority.
564.	Exodus 22:29	Making and possessing wine and liquors is permitted.
565.	Exodus 22:31	Prohibition against eating flesh killed by another animal.
566.	Exodus 23:1-3	Law against lying and being a false witness and against vigilante justice.

567. Exodus 23:4-5 One must rescue an enemy's animal from going astray or being overburdened.
568. Exodus 23:6-7 One must not be a false witness against the poor and it is unlawful to slay the righteous.
569. Exodus 23:8 Do not take a gift that changes your mind – no lobbying allowed.
570. Exodus 23:10-11 On the seventh year you may not plant or harvest your fields but must leave them for the poor and animals to glean.
571. Exodus 23:12 You may work six days; the seventh day is for resting yourself and your animals.
572. Exodus 23:13 Prohibition against mentioning or discussing other gods.
573. Exodus 23:14-16 Three feasts for the year will be (1) Unleavened bread, (2) Harvest, and (3) Ingathering- [year's end].
574. Exodus 23:17 Three times each year males must appear before God.
575. Exodus 23:18 No leavened bread may be used in a sacrifice and no fat may be left until morning.
576. Exodus 23:19 First fruits are for God; no kid (goat) may be seethed in its mother's milk.
577. Exodus 23:20-24 God provides an angel to lead Israel; they must obey the angel and it will conquer their enemies.
578. Exodus 23:25 If He is served, God will bless bread and water and will take away all sickness.
579. Exodus 23:26 God says Israel's children will not die, women will not be barren, and all will live to grow up.
580. Exodus 23:27 God will destroy all people of Canaan or they will flee from Israelis.

581. Exodus 23:28 God sends hornets before Israel to drive out the Hivites, Canaanites, and Hittites.
582. Exodus 23:29-30 God will slowly drive out the enemy as Israel makes use of Canaan.
583. Exodus 23:31 Israeli boundaries will be from the Red Sea, up the Mediterranean Sea and East to the Euphrates River and North to Turkey.
584. Exodus 23:32-33 No covenant is allowed with any in Canaan nor can they stay with their gods.
585. Exodus 24:1-2 God calls Moses, Aaron, Nadab, Abihu, and 70 elders of Israel to meet with Him.
586. Exodus 24:3-4 Moses tells Israel all of God's Words, writes them down, and builds an altar with twelve pillars. (5 books of the Law)
587. Exodus 24:5-6 Moses sends young men to do burnt offerings; they take one half of the blood and sprinkle it on the altar.
588. Exodus 24:7 Moses has written and presents the "Book of the Covenant." The people swear obedience.
589. Exodus 24:8 Moses sprinkles second half of the blood on the people; it is the "Blood of the Covenant."
590. Exodus 24:9-11 Moses, Aaron, Nadab, Abihu, and the 70 elders see God standing on heavenly sapphire; they saw God, ate, and drank.
591. Exodus 24:12 God tells Moses to come up on the mountain to get the 10 Commandments.
592. Exodus 24:13 Moses takes "his minister" Joshua up onto the mountain with him.
593. Exodus 24:14 Moses left Aaron and Hur to be in charge of Israel.
594. Exodus 24:15 Clouds cover the mountain for 6 days; on 7th day God speaks; Moses stays on the mountain for 40 days and 40 nights.

595. Exodus 25:1-7 God tells Moses to take (only willing) offering of all things from Israel.
596. Exodus 25:8-9 God says to make Him a Sanctuary; God gives pattern for the Tabernacle
597. Exodus 25:10-15 God gives instructions for making the “Ark.”
598. Exodus 25:16:29 God gives instructions for making the Mercy Seat, Cherubims, Table, Dishes, etc. for the Tabernacle.
599. Exodus 25:30 God says “Showbread” must stay on the table always.
600. Exodus 25:31-37 God’s instructions for making the candlestick (Menora) with 3 branches on each side and one in the middle.
601. Exodus 25:38-40 Instructions for making snuff dishes; pattern was shown to Moses on the mountain.
602. Exodus 26:1-13 God gives pattern for curtains, loops, and taches for the tabernacle.
603. Exodus 26:14 God says the Tabernacle (tent) must be made of rams’ skins (dyed red) and badgers’ skins.
604. Exodus 26:15-29 God gives patterns for boards used to build the tabernacle, which must be made of shittim wood covered with gold and pattern for the bars and sockets.
605. Exodus 26:30 God gives transporting instructions for the tabernacle.
606. Exodus 26:31-33 God’s instructions for hanging the veil between the “Holy Place” and the “Most Holy.”
607. Exodus 26:34-37 God’s instructions for setting up the contents of the tabernacle.

608. Exodus 27:1-8 God's instructions for making the altar (square), pans, fleshhooks, rings, staves, and grate, etc.
609. Exodus 27:9-19 God gives pattern for pillars, hangings, sockets, gate of the court, size, etc. of the tabernacle.
610. Exodus 27:20-21 People are instructed to bring oil for the lamp (to burn always); Aaron and sons are to be in charge of the tabernacle always.
611. Exodus 28:1-43 Aaron and his sons Nadab, Abihu, Eleazar, and Ithamar receive pattern for their robes with jewels, tribe names, etc.
612. Exodus 29:1-3 God gives list of items that may be sacrificed: meat, bread, wafers, etc.
613. Exodus 29:4-9 God gives instructions for anointing Aaron and his sons, and their garments with oil.
614. Exodus 29:10-20 God's instructions for killing the sacrifices, dividing the meat, and placing the blood on certain parts of the priests' bodies.
615. Exodus 29:21 Instructions for sprinkling sacrifice blood on Aaron and his sons.
616. Exodus 29:22-24 Instructions for making wave offerings of meat, bread, and wafers (+V26-27).
617. Exodus 29:25-31 Instructions for burnt offerings, heave offerings, and peace offerings.
618. Exodus 29:32-34 God says that only Aaron and his sons can eat from the offerings.
619. Exodus 29:35-41 God gives instructions for the type and times of offerings, length, etc.
620. Exodus 29:42-46 God gives instructions for His being in the tabernacle and being their God.
621. Exodus 30:1-9 God's instructions for using incense at the altar, the dimensions and use.

622. Exodus 30:10 Aaron instructed to make blood atonement on the Horns of the Altar once each year.
623. Exodus 30:12-15 God tells Moses to do census of Israel and take “Ransom for His Soul” from each Israeli 20 years old and up.
624. Exodus 30:16 “Atonement for Your Souls” money is directed by God to be used to service the Tabernacle.
625. Exodus 30:18-21 God directs that a laver of brass (basin) be made to wash the feet and hands of priests before they enter the Tabernacle.
626. Exodus 30:23-28 God directs that holy oil and perfume be used on all tabernacle contents and priests.
627. Exodus 31:2-5 God gives Bezaleel, from the Tribe of Judah, wisdom in crafting precious metals and stones.
628. Exodus 31:6-11 God gives Aholiab, from the Tribe of Dan, wisdom to craft furniture and cloth and to make anointing oil.
629. Exodus 31:12-17 God again states the use of the Sabbath; the death penalty will be executed on anyone working on the Sabbath.
630. Exodus 31:18 God writes on 2 tables of stone His Testimony with His finger and gives the stone tables to Moses on Mt. Sinai.
631. Exodus 32:1-6 People of Israel become tired of waiting for Moses to return from off Mt. Sinai and demand that Aaron make a Golden Calf god for them to worship.
632. Exodus 32:7-9 God tells Moses of Israel’s idol worship and to return to them from off Mt. Sinai.
633. Exodus 32:10-13 God plans to kill all Israeli idol worshipers; Moses intercedes.

634. Exodus 32:14 GOD CHANGES HIS MIND and repents because Moses tells Him that the Egyptians would chide Him and them for their failure.
635. Exodus 32:15-16 Moses returns from Mt. Sinai with the 2 Tables, which are written, on both sides, front and back, by God.
636. Exodus 32:17-18 Joshua hears the noise of celebration and singing as they ascend Mt. Sinai.
637. Exodus 32:19 Moses sees the golden calf idol and celebration; he is mad and throws down the tables and breaks them.
638. Exodus 32:20 Moses takes the golden calf idol, grinds it to powder, puts it in water, and makes the Israelis drink it.
639. Exodus 32:21-24 Aaron makes excuses for making the golden calf idol.
640. Exodus 32:25 Israel was naked of clothes for Aaron had made them strip naked before their enemies.
641. Exodus 32:26-28 Moses calls for those on God's side, then has the Levites slay 3,000 men who had worshipped the idol, with the sword.
642. Exodus 32:29-35 Moses begs for the life of the Israelis, asks God to blame him; God sends a plague on Israel.
643. Exodus 33:1-2 God says He will send an angel before Israel to drive out their enemies.
644. Exodus 33:3 God says He will not be in the midst of the Israeli people going into Canaan because they are too bad.
645. Exodus 33:4-6 The people of Israel repent and strip off all of their body and dress ornaments.
646. Exodus 33:7 God orders the Tabernacle (tent) be pitched outside the Israeli camp.

647. Exodus 33:8-19 Moses and Joshua go into the Tabernacle; God appears in a cloud and talks to Moses.
648. Exodus 33:20-23 God tells Moses that he can't see His (God's) face, then passes by so that Moses can see his "back parts."
649. Exodus 34:1-4 God tells Moses to hew two more stones and to come up to Mt. Sinai the second time.
650. Exodus 34:5-7 God says He will punish the guilty of Israel to the 4th generation.
651. Exodus 34:8-9 Moses worships God and asks a pardon for the stiffnecked iniquity of the people of Israel.
652. Exodus 34:10-13 God makes a Covenant with Israel to drive out the Canaanites; God demands their total destruction and no fellowship with them.
653. Exodus 34:14 God says His name is "Jealous" and that He is a jealous God.
654. Exodus 34:15-22 God gives the reason for no contact with the Canaanites and reviews His covenant and observances with Israel.
655. Exodus 34:23-26 God orders that three times each year all male Israeli children must appear before Him; He reviews the sacrifices.
656. Exodus 34:27-28 God gives the New Commandments to Moses but Moses had to do the writing (carving) of them; Moses then fasts for 40 days and 40 nights on Mt. Sinai.
657. Exodus 34:29-35 Moses returns from off Mt. Sinai; his face is a bright white and he has to cover his face to talk with Israel.
658. Exodus 35:1-3 Moses gives God's rules to Israel; no fire on the Sabbath.
659. Exodus 35:4-19 Moses instructs on the offerings the people must make to prepare the Tabernacle.

660. Exodus 35:20-35 Israeli people bring all of their offerings, the women spin, and Moses reviews the artisan work of Bezallel and Aholiab.
661. Exodus 36:1-7 The artisans begin their work on the Tabernacle; Moses must stop Israel's offerings because they give in excess.
662. Exodus 36:8-38 Moses reviews the building of the Tabernacle and its contents.
663. Exodus 37:1-29 Bezaleel of the Tribe of Judah makes the ark and gold works inside the altar and Tabernacle.
664. Exodus 38:1-31 Bezaleel and Aholiab of Tribe of Dan, who is a super engraver, do all of the cunning work on the entire Tabernacle.
665. Exodus 39:1-43 The making of the furnishings and priest robes (V23 – Hole in robes).
666. Exodus 40:1-33 Moses sets up the Tabernacle and anoints it with oil, etc.; Moses anoints the priests also.
667. Exodus 40:34 The Cloud of God covers the tent of the congregation; God's glory fills the Tabernacle.
668. Exodus 40:35 Moses is not able to enter the Tabernacle while the cloud fills it.
669. Exodus 40:36 When the cloud is lifted, the Israelites are allowed to travel.
670. Exodus 40:37-38 The cloud remains upon the Tabernacle by day and fire by night all through Israel's journey to Canaan.
