

FIRST CHRONICLES

2240. First Chronicles 1:1-11 Lineage from Adam to Naphtuhim (note different spellings from Genesis).
2241. First Chronicles 1:12 The Philistines came from Casluhim, son of Mizraim – of Ham.
2242. First Chronicles 1:13-16 Canaan begat the Jebusites, Amorites, Girgashites, Hivites, Arkites, Sinites, Arvadites, Zemarites, and Hamathites.
2243. First Chronicles 1:17-19 Lineage of Shem – Peleg – earth was divided in his days.
2244. First Chronicles 1:20-28 Shem’s lineage includes the Patriarchs, Abraham and Isaac plus Ishmael.
2245. First Chronicles 1:29-31 Sons of Ishmael – twelve names listed.
2246. First Chronicles 1:32-33 Sons of Abraham by concubine Keturah (6) plus their sons.
2247. First Chronicles 1:34-42 Abraham’s lineage through his son Isaac and Esau – includes Korah (Koran).
2248. First Chronicles 1:43-50 Kings of Edom (Esau) and their reigns.
2249. First Chronicles 1:51-54 Dukes of Edom – names (lineage of Esau).
2250. First Chronicles 2:1-2 Lineage of Jacob (Israel) – names of his twelve sons.
2251. First Chronicles 2:3 Sons of Judah (3); Er was an evil son and God slew him; his mother was Shua, a Canaanitess.
2252. First Chronicles 2:4 Sons of Judah by daughter-in-law Tamar (2).
2253. First Chronicles 2:5-10 Judah’s grandsons down to Nahshon, “Prince of the Children of Judah;” includes Achar, the “Troubler of Israel.”

2254. First Chronicles 2:11-12 Nahshon's grandson was Boaz (Esther's husband) whose grandson was Jesse, father of King David.
2255. First Chronicles 2:13-15 Jesse's seven sons named; David was the youngest and became the first King of Judah.
2256. First Chronicles 2:16-17 King David's sisters Zeruiah and Abigail and their children; Abigail married an Ishmaelite.
2257. First Chronicles 2:18-41 Lineage of Caleb, first great grandson of Judah.
2258. First Chronicles 2:42 Caleb II; lineage of Judah; his grandson was Hebron (Hebrew).
2259. First Chronicles 2:43-55 Lineage of Hebron includes another Caleb and two Bethlehems.
2260. First Chronicles 3:1-9 King David's nineteen sons and one daughter, Tamar; does not include other unidentified daughters (possibly) and children of his concubines. David lives seven and a half years in Hebron and thirty-three years in Jerusalem as king of Judah and later king of Judah and Israel.
2261. First Chronicles 3:10-24 King Solomon's fifteen sons, their names and lineage.
2262. First Chronicles 4:1-23 More lineage of Judah: craftsmen, farmers, leaders, etc.
2263. First Chronicles 4:24-43 Lineage of Simeon, cities, wars; Shimei had the most children, twenty-two.
2264. First Chronicles 5:1 Genealogy of Reuben is disallowed; he was the firstborn but defiled his father's bed and his birthright is given to Joseph's sons.
2265. First Chronicles 5:2-10 Reuben had sons named Gog and Baal and dwelled in Gilead.
2266. First Chronicles 5:11-22 Lineage of Gad; he lived in Gilead, joined Reuben and Manasseh and had a forty-four thousand, seven hundred man army.

2267. First Chronicles 5:23-26 Lineage of Manasseh; they were idol worshippers and were taken captive forever by Assyria.
2268. Chronicles 6:1-48 First Lineage of Levi; includes Hebron, Aaron, Moses, Miriam, priests and singers.
2269. First Chronicles 6:49-81 Aaron's lineage of high priests; they are given Hebron and the refuge and priest cities in other tribes.
2270. First Chronicles 7:1-5 Lineage of Issachar; they were valiant men of war.
2271. First Chronicles 7:6-12 Lineage of Benjamin; they were also mighty men of war.
2272. First Chronicles 7:13 Lineage of Naphtali.
2273. First Chronicles 7:14-19 Lineage of Manasseh revisited.
2274. First Chronicles 7:20-29 Lineage of Ephraim; his sons were slain; he had a daughter, Sherah, who built a city.
2275. First Chronicles 7:30-40 Lineage of Asher; they were mighty men of war.
2276. First Chronicles 8:1-40 Lineage of Benjamin revisited and amplified; his tribe includes King Saul and his son Jonathan.
2277. First Chronicles 9:1-34 Inhabitants of tribes living and serving in Jerusalem and their duties to kings and the Temple.
2278. First Chronicles 9:35-44 Lineage of King Saul backwards and forwards.
2279. First Chronicles 10:1-14 Repeat of King Saul's Philistine battle and death (also in First Samuel 13:31).
2280. First Chronicles 11:1-3 Israel comes to King David of Judah at Hebron and anoints him King of Israel.

2281. First Chronicles 11:4 Jerusalem is “Jebus;” the Jebusites inhabit that land.
2282. First Chronicles 11:5-6 The Jebusites refuse King David’s entry; military chief, Joab, conquers them.
2283. First Chronicles 11:7 David dwells in the castle; Jerusalem is called the “City of David.”
2284. First Chronicles 11:8-16 King David’s three “Mighty Men;” he had thirty captains in the Philistine battle.
2285. First Chronicles 11:17-19 David fights the Philistines at Bethlehem; he asks for water, brave men deliver it, and he pours it out for courtesy.
2286. First Chronicles 11:20-47 King David’s mighty men by name and fame; Uriaah, the Hittite is one of them.
2287. First Chronicles 12:1-2 David’s mighty men of war are ambidextrous with bows and slings.
2288. First Chronicles 12:3-13 King David’s other mighty men by name and fame.
2289. First Chronicles 12:14-40 All eleven tribes plus the two half tribes come with their armies to celebrate and support King David.
2290. First Chronicles 13:1-8 David invites all of Israel to come; they bring the Ark from Baalah (Kirjath-jearim) to Jerusalem.
2291. First Chronicles 13:9-10 Oxen pulling the Ark stumble; Uzza touches the Ark to steady it and dies (repeat account).
2292. First Chronicles 13:11-14 King David is upset over Uzza’s death and places the Ark with Obed-edom who is blessed for having it.
2293. First Chronicles 14:1-2 A repeat account of King Hiram of Tyre helping King David build his house.
2294. First Chronicles 14:3-7 David takes more wives in Jerusalem; names of thirteen children born there.

2295. First Chronicles 14:8-17 King David fights the Philistines, burns their idols, and all nations fear him.
2296. First Chronicles 15:1-29 A tent is prepared for the Ark, singers and music bands are trained; Michal, daughter of Saul is mad at David for dancing (repeat account).
2297. First Chronicles 16:1-36 The Ark is in Jerusalem, priests are chosen, and David writes Psalms of Praise to God.
2298. First Chronicles 16:37-43 More ritual appointments, covenants, and offerings are done; the people return home.
2299. First Chronicles 17:1-27 King David wants to build the Temple but God says, "No, your son will build it." God and David discuss it.
2300. First Chronicles 18:1-13 David defeats the Philistines, Moab, and Syria; Abishai slays eighteen thousand Edomites in "Valley of Salt."
2301. First Chronicles 18:14-17 King David's leaders; his sons were chiefs.
2302. First Chronicles 19:1-5 The Ammonite King dies; King David sends regrets and his envoy is shamed, they are shaved, and their garments cut off.
2303. First Chronicles 19:6-19 New King Hanun of Ammon hires warriors against Israel from Mesopotamia and Syria; they are defeated and forty-seven thousand are killed.
2304. First Chronicles 20:1-3 Joab defeats Ammon; David takes the crown of Ammon and the enemy is destroyed.
2305. First Chronicles 20:4-8 Giants of Gath (Philistine), each with twelve fingers and twelve toes, are slain by Israel.
2306. First Chronicles 21:1-3 Satan provokes King David to do a census of Israel and Judah; Joab is upset but obeys.
2307. First Chronicles 21:4-6 The census is one million, one hundred thousand soldiers in Israel, four hundred seventy thousand in Judah; Levi and Benjamin do the count because Joab refuses.

2308. First Chronicles 21:7-15 God is angry and gives King David three choices of punishment; David allows God to choose pestilence; seventy thousand are killed; the Death Angel is stopped from destroying Jerusalem.
2309. First Chronicles 21:16-30 King David sees the Angel of Death; the angel orders Prophet Gad to have David build an altar.
2310. First Chronicles 22:1-19 King David prepares materials to build the Temple; God tells him that his son Solomon will build it.
2311. First Chronicles 23:1-3 King David is old and makes Solomon king; he numbers the Levites over age thirty; there are thirty-eight thousand of them.
2312. First Chronicles 23:4 Twenty-four thousand Levites are assigned to work on the Temple, six thousand are to be officers and judges.
2313. First Chronicles 23:5-6 Four thousand Levites are assigned as porters and four thousand praise musicians; there are three groups: Gershons, Kohaths, and Meraris.
2314. First Chronicles 23:7-13 Lineage of three groups of Levites by name and duty.
2315. First Chronicles 23:14-23 Lineage of Moses in the Tribe of Levi.
2316. First Chronicles 23:24-32 Levitical priests must be twenty years old or older; their duties and rituals at the Temple.
2317. First Chronicles 24:1-19 Lineage of Aaron and of Levites, the number of orders, names, and duties.
2318. First Chronicles 24:20-31 Lineage and acts of the rest of the Levites by name.
2319. First Chronicles 25:1-31 Asaph and the music ministry, prophesy by instruments, and the identification and names of music wards.

2320. First Chronicles 26:1-19 Divisions of Levite porters, names, and duties.
2321. First Chronicles 26:20-32 Affairs of the Israeli treasurer and administrators of royal affairs.
2322. First Chronicles 27:1-15 Captains of Israeli forces for each of the twelve months and their names.
2323. First Chronicles 27:16-22 Heads of all Israeli tribes at King David's time; excludes Gad and Asher.
2324. First Chronicles 27:23-34 Heads of all of David's affairs, i.e., farms, livestock, army, and administration.
2325. First Chronicles 28:1-10 King David speaks to all of Israel and Judah about God's affairs, Solomon, and the Temple.
2326. First Chronicles 28:11-21 David gives Solomon the blueprints of the Temple, contents, and charges of his duties.
2327. First Chronicles 29:1-5 David's preparation of jewels, gold, silver, etc., for the Temple.
2328. First Chronicles 29:6-30 All of Israel contributes to the Temple; King David's charge to Israel; Solomon becomes king.
