

## **JOB**

2516. Job 1:1-2 Job lived in the land of “Uz,” he loved God, and had seven sons and three daughters.
2517. Job 1:3 Job is the greatest (richest) man in the East; he has seven thousand sheep, three thousand camels, five hundred yoke of oxen, and five hundred donkeys.
2518. Job 1:4-5 Job’s sons and daughters are having a feast; Job sanctifies them and does burnt offerings for them each day.
2519. Job 1:6 Meanwhile, there is a heavenly assembly; the Sons of God present themselves to God; Satan comes too.
2520. Job 1:7 God inquires and Satan says to God that he has been roaming to and fro on the earth.
2521. Job 1:8 God brags on Job, says that Job is perfect, upright, and does no evil.
2522. Job 1:9-11 Satan says that God protects Job; he says, “Take away all that he has and Job will curse God.”
2523. Job 1:12 God takes the challenge and gives control of Job to Satan, but says, “You can’t take Job’s life or permanently harm him.”
2524. Job 1:13 Job’s children are all feasting and drinking wine in the eldest brother’s house.
2525. Job 1:14-15 A servant reports to Job that Sabeans have taken all of his oxen, and donkeys and his workers have been killed.
2526. Job 1:16 Another servant reports that a fire of God from heaven has consumed all of his sheep and his servants.

2527. Job 1:17 Another servant reports that three bands of Chaldeans have taken all of his camels and killed their keepers.
2528. Job 1:18-19 Another servant reports that a great wind has made his eldest son's house fall on and kill all of his sons and daughters.
2529. Job 1:20-22 Job shaves his head, gets naked, and praises God, saying, "The Lord gives and takes away."
2530. Job 2:1-5 Satan visits God again and says, "Job will curse God if his health is taken away."
2531. Job 2:6-8 God says anything but death is okay; Satan sends boils upon Job; he scrapes himself and sits in ashes.
2532. Job 2:9-10 Job's wife tells him to, "Curse God and die;" Job says he will take the bad with the good.
2533. Job 2:11 Job's three friends come: Eliphaz, a Temanite; Bildad, a Shuhite; and Zophar, a Naamathite.
2534. Job 2:12-13 Job's friends tear off their clothes, cover their heads with dust, weep, and sit with Job silently for seven days.
2535. Job 3:1-26 Job does a sermon chapter, cursing the day of his birth (Special Verse # 17).
2536. Job 4:1-21 Friend Eliphaz speaks a chapter saying that Job has sinned, which is the cause of his grief and loss.
2537. Job 5:1-27 Eliphaz continues his lecture and says that God's chastisement is natural for sinners.
2538. Job 6:1-5 Job answers Eliphaz with questions of, "How could this happen?"
2539. Job 6:6 Job asks a strange question, "Is there taste in the white of an egg?"

2540. Job 6:7-13 Job requests that God take his life so that he can find comfort.
2541. Job 6:14-30 Job analyzes his friends and says their help is lacking in his time of need.
2542. Job 7:1-21 Job speaks of his wretched condition and how low man is.
2543. Job 8:1-22 Friend Bildad speaks of God's righteous judgment against Job but defends him.
2544. Job 9:1-35 Job answers, talks of God's might and his lack of strength; he uses the word "Daysman."
2545. Job 10:1-22 Job speaks to God, asks not to be condemned, and declares his innocence.
2546. Job 11:1-20 Friend Zophar answers Job and says, "You are lying when you claim no cause to your suffering."
2547. Job 12:1-25 Job answers that God punishes the good and evil both like nature.
2548. Job 13:1-28 Job continues to say his friends are fakes and says, "THOUGH HE SLAY ME, YET WILL I TRUST HIM!"
2549. Job 14:1-22 Job analyzes man as a trivial object of God not deserving of much.
2550. Job 15:1-35 Eliphaz speaks again, chastises Job and says that his own mouth condemns him.
2551. Job 16:1-22 Job says his friends are miserable comforters and talks of his sufferings.
2552. Job 17:1-16 Job calls his three friends mockers and hypocrites and says, "Not one of you is wise."
2553. Job 18:1-21 Bildad speaks again and accuses Job of accusing them falsely and says that Job is punished for being wicked.

2554. Job 19:1-19 Job answers that all have turned against him, family, servants, and friends.
2555. Job 19:20-29 Job says, "I am escaped with the SKIN OF MY TEETH" and "I know that my Redeemer lives."
2556. Job 20:1-29 Zophar speaks again and says that Job is wicked and will be punished many ways.
2557. Job 21:1-34 Job speaks of punishment to the truly wicked and accuses his friends of untruth.
2558. Job 22:1-30 Eliphaz speaks to Job about the value and rewards of repentance.
2559. Job 23:1-17 Job talks of being cut off from God and being unable to reason with Him.
2560. Job 24:1-25 Job speaks of the wicked and their being exalted and then brought down.
2561. Job 25:1-6 Bildad speaks of God's might and man's lack of justification.
2562. Job 26:1-14 Job speaks of God not helping the weak and how powerful God is.
2563. Job 27:1-23 Job's parable of faithfulness and destiny of the wicked.
2564. Job 28:1-28 Job speaks of God's riches and the value of wisdom being even greater.
2565. Job 29:1-25 Job continues his parable and reminisces of his former prestige.
2566. Job 30:1-31 Job speaks of the meanness of youth and his derision, he says, "I am a brother to dragons!"
2567. Job 31:1-40 Job says if he has sinned, then punish him; he prays for a hearing and says he will speak no more.

2568. Job 32:1-22 Young Elihu comes on the scene and condemns all four of them, Job and his three friends; he says that the aged are unwise.
2569. Job 33:1-33 Elihu accuses Job of his many sins and says he will teach Job wisdom.
2570. Job 34:1-37 Elihu blasts Job, says he is without knowledge and is in rebellion against God.
2571. Job 35:1-16 Elihu accuses Job of claiming more righteousness than God and says Job is evil.
2572. Job 36:1-33 Elihu speaks for God and says He forsakes none, especially the righteous.
2573. Job 37:1-24 Elihu finishes by saying God is mighty and just and not the cause of Job's hurt.
2574. Job 38:1-41 God speaks to Job from a whirlwind and asks, "Where were you when I made the universe and nature?"
2575. Job 39:1-30 God explains His power to Job; He mentions the "unicorn" and the nature of wild creatures.
2576. Job 40:1-24 God and Job exchange; Job is told to dress and abase his enemies. God speaks of a powerful animal "Behemoth" which grazes like an ox, is powerful and his power is in the navel of his belly.
2577. Job 41:1-13 God explains "Leviathan," "None can capture or contain him."
2578. Job 41:14 God says Leviathan has teeth "all around" and cannot be bridled.
2579. Job 41:15-17 God says Leviathan's scales are sealed with no air in between and his scales cannot be pierced.
2580. Job 41:18-21 God says Leviathan sneezes fire, his eyes shine like the day, out of his nostrils go fire and smoke, and flames leap from his mouth.

2581. Job 41:22-30  
God says Leviathan turns sorrow to joy, his flesh is so strong that it can't be moved, his heart is hard as a millstone, when he raises up it scares the mighty, no weapon is effective against him, he destroys metals as though they are rotten wood, all weapons used against him are turned into stubble, he laughs at the spear, and sharp stones under him are pushed into the mire.
2582. Job 41:31-32  
God says Leviathan makes the ocean boil like a sea of ointment and leaves a path of fire under the ocean where he has been like a volcano crack under water.
2583. Job 41:33-34  
God says Leviathan is the only earth creature without fear; he looks upon land and is king over all people because of his strength and might.
2584. Job 42:1-6  
Job answers God, "I am sorry that I didn't understand, I heard you before, now I see you (God), I abhor myself and repent in dust and ashes."
2585. Job 42:7-8  
God speaks to Eliphaz and Job's other two older friends, "Prepare and sacrifice a burnt offering of seven bullocks and seven rams and ask Job to pray for you --- or else!"
2586. Job 42:9  
Eliphaz, Bildad, and Zophar make the offering and are forgiven (No mention is made of Elihu, C32-37).
2587. Job 42:10-12  
God heals Job, gives him double what he had before, all family and friends have a banquet for him and give him riches; Job's end is better than his beginning.
2588. Job 42:13-15  
Job again has seven sons and three daughters, Jemima, Kezia, and Keren-happuch, the three most beautiful women in the world (An unusual inclusion in the Bible, for women are seldom given credit); Job gives each of his three daughters an inheritance like his sons'.

2589. Job 42:16-17

Job lives another one hundred forty years; he sees four generations of grandchildren; he dies being very old.
