

JOSHUA

1230. Joshua 1:1-4 God speaks to Joshua, gives him the boundaries of Israel (the Holy Land), which are from the Mediterranean Sea to the Euphrates River.
1231. Joshua 1:5-7 God tells Joshua to be strong and their enemies will be conquered.
1232. Joshua 1:8 God says the “Book Of The Law” must be followed to give Israel power.
1233. Joshua 1:10-11 Joshua gives the order for Israel to “pack up” and prepare to cross the Jordan River.
1234. Joshua 1:12-18 The Reubenites, Gadites, and Half Tribe of Manasseh fight with Israel, then return to the east side of the Jordan River.
1235. Joshua 2:1-2 Joshua sends 2 spies to Jericho to Rahab; the King of Jericho knows they are there.
1236. Joshua 2:3-6 The King of Jericho tells Rahab to give him the spies; she hides them and says that they have escaped.
1237. Joshua 2:7 The King of Jericho’s army pursues the spies thinking they have escaped.
1238. Joshua 2:8-11 Rahab tells the spies of Jericho’s horror of Israel and of the miracles which they have heard that God has done for Israel.
1239. Joshua 2:12-14 Rahab asks for her family’s life for her service to the spies; they agree.
1240. Joshua 2:15-17 Rahab lowers the spies down the outside of Jericho’s wall and tells them to hide for three days.
1241. Joshua 2:18-21 Israel’s spies instruct Rahab to tie a red thread in her window and those inside will be saved when Israel attacks.

1242. Joshua 2:22-24 The spies hide for three days and then return to Joshua; they tell him that Jericho faints from fear of Israel.
1243. Joshua 3:1 Israel moves from Shittim to the bank of the Jordan River across from the east side of Jericho.
1244. Joshua 3:2-4 Israel is instructed to follow the ARK but to stay two thousand cubits behind it.
1245. Joshua 3:5-8 Joshua is to be magnified before Israel; he has the Levites take up the ARK and go to the edge of the Jordan River.
1246. Joshua 3:9-12 Joshua tells Israel that they will defeat Canaan; he picks a representative from each tribe of Israel (C4).
1247. Joshua 3:13-17 Jordan River parts far from the city “Adam” (Garden of Eden?) beside Zaretan and across from Jericho; Israel crosses on dry ground. Those carrying the ark stop and hold it in the middle of the river until everyone is across.
1248. Joshua 4:1-7 Twelve chosen men are told to take 12 rocks from the dry Jordan for a memorial.
1249. Joshua 4:8-10 The memorial of 12 rocks is built in the midst of the Jordan River at the crossing place.
1250. Joshua 4:11-13 The Army of Israel crossing the river was 40,000 strong; they enter the Plain of Jericho.
1251. Joshua 4:14 Joshua is magnified by God before Israel and is feared as Moses was feared, all of his life.
1252. Joshua 4:15-18 Priests stayed in the middle of the Jordan River with the ark until all of Israel’s army crossed.
1253. Joshua 4:18-19 When the ark is carried out of the river bed the water flow resumes.

1254. Joshua 4:20-24 The 12 stones are removed from the river and taken to Gilgal as a memorial of the parting waters.
1255. Joshua 5:1 Amorites and Canaanites are in terror over God parting the river waters for Israel.
1256. Joshua 5:2-8 Israel had the second circumcision of those males born in the wilderness and called the place the “Hill of the Foreskins.”
1257. Joshua 5:9-11 Gilgal is named, Israel’s 40-year-old corn taken from Egypt is eaten, and the Passover is observed in the Plain of Jericho.
1258. Joshua 5:12 The day after the Passover is observed, the MANNA ceased and Israel began eating food from Canaan.
1259. Joshua 5:13 The “Captain of the Host of the Lord” (Melchizedek?) appears with a sword before Joshua; tells him to remove his shoes, he is standing on holy ground.
1260. Joshua 6:1-2 Jericho is sealed; God gives the city to Joshua.
1261. Joshua 6:3 Joshua’s army is instructed to march around Jericho once each day for 6 days.
1262. Joshua 6:4-5 On 7th day Joshua’s army marches around the city seven times with the ark, then with trumpets of ram horns they give a long blast, yell loudly, and the walls fall down flat.
1263. Joshua 6:10 Israel is forbidden to speak for 7 days prior to their shouting.
1264. Joshua 6:18 Israel is instructed against taking the “accursed thing” (idol-treasure) from Jericho.
1265. Joshua 6:19 Israel army permitted to take silver, gold, brass, and iron from Jericho for the treasury of God.
1266. Joshua 6:21 Jericho’s walls fall, all animals, men, women, and children are slain.

1267. Joshua 6:22-23 Israel's two spies go into the city and rescue Rahab, her family, and her goods from Jericho.
1268. Joshua 6:24 Jericho is burned and never rebuilt, cursed by Joshua; Rahab and her family live their lives in Israel.
1269. Joshua 7:1 Achan of the tribe of Judah took "the accursed thing" from Jericho as booty, an idol.
1270. Joshua 7:2-5 Israel spies out and attacks Ai and are slaughtered by a small Ai group.
1271. Joshua 7:6-9 Joshua is devastated over the defeat, calls out to God and asks, "why?"
1272. Joshua 7:10-13 God tells Israel it is condemned by "the accursed thing" (idol of Jericho) and must find and destroy it.
1273. Joshua 7:14-15 A survey of Israeli tribes is made; the one who took the idol, his family, and his goods must be burned.
1274. Joshua 7:16-21 Achan is identified, confesses to taking garments, silver, and gold from Jericho and hiding them.
1275. Joshua 7:22 Israel takes Achan, his wife, children, animals, and goods to the Valley of Achor where they are all stoned and burned.
1276. Joshua 8:1-2 God instructs Joshua on destroying Ai by hiding and ambush.
1277. Joshua 8:3-17 Ambush of Ai is ready; Joshua and band approach and draw all fighters out of Ai.
1278. Joshua 8:18-22 Ai army of 12 thousand is surrounded by Israel and completely destroyed; Ai is burned.
1279. Joshua 8:23-29 Ai's king is taken and hanged; king and city are buried but their animals are taken.

1280. Joshua 8:30-32 Joshua builds an altar of whole stones on Mt. Ebal and carves the 10 Commandments on them.
1281. Joshua 8:33-35 Israel gathers around the ark and Joshua reads the whole book of the law.
1282. Joshua 9:1-2 All Canaanite countries hear of Israel's victories and arm themselves to fight.
1283. Joshua 9:3-27 Gibeonite Hivites disguise themselves as from a far country and survive as slaves of Israel.
1284. Joshua 10:1-5 Several Canaanite countries band together and besiege Gibeon for revenge.
1285. Joshua 10:6-11 Joshua comes to Gibeon's rescue; Amorites are slaughtered and God rains stones and hail which kills the rest of the enemy.
1286. Joshua 10:12-14 Joshua asks God to stop the sun and moon; God complies and both the sun and moon are still for a whole day.
1287. Joshua 10:16 Five kings of the Amorites are defeated and hide in a cave at Makkedah.
1288. Joshua 10:17-27 The kings of Jerusalem, Hebron, Jarmuth, Lachish, and Eglon are hanged and buried.
1289. Joshua 10:28 Joshua's army fights Makkedah, slays everyone.
1290. Joshua 10:29-30 Israel destroys Libnah, kills everyone and hangs their king.
1291. Joshua 10:31-33 Israel destroys Lachish, kills everyone and also the king of Gezer and their army.
1292. Joshua 10:34-35 Israel destroys Eglon, kills everyone.
1293. Joshua 10:36-37 Israel destroys Hebron, Kills everyone.
1294. Joshua 10:38-39 Israel destroys Debir, kills everyone.

1295. Joshua 10:40 Israel has destroyed all countries of the hills, south, vale, and springs.
1296. Joshua 10:40-43 Israel has destroyed all in Kadesh-barnea, Gaza, and country of Goshen unto Gibeon; they then return to camp at Gilgal.
1297. Joshua 11:1-5 Other countries of Canaan join forces against Israel at Merom.
1298. Joshua 11:6 God tells Joshua he will deliver Israel from all of the Canaanite forces and he must then hough their horses.
1299. Joshua 11:7-9 Joshua and Israel defeat the multi-countries, hough their horses and burn their chariots.
1300. Joshua 11:11-12 Israel takes Hazor and all cities of kings and kills everyone.
1301. Joshua 11:13-14 “Cities of Strength” are spared, their animals taken, and people all killed, as commanded by Moses through Joshua.
1302. Joshua 11:15-20 Summary of Israel’s conquerings in Canaan.
1303. Joshua 11:21-23 Israel takes the rest of Canaan in the north and then rests from war.
1304. Joshua 12:1-24 Israel’s summary of cities, countries, and kings defeated and destroyed.
1305. Joshua 13:1-14 Joshua is old; god tells of countries yet to be taken.
1306. Joshua 13:15-23 Inheritance lands given to the tribe of Reuben.
1307. Joshua 13:24-28 Inheritance lands given to the tribe of Gad.
1308. Joshua 13:29-32 Inheritance lands given to the Half tribe of Manasseh.
1309. Joshua 13:33 No inheritance is given to the tribe of Levi.
1310. Joshua 14:1-5 Canaan inheritance – dividing lands between Israeli tribes.

1311. Joshua 14:7-15 Caleb, now 85 years old, age 40 when sent to spy out Canaan, asks for and is given Hebron and a mountain.
1312. Joshua 15:1-12 Judah becomes a large country in the Holy Land (Canaan).
1313. Joshua 15:13-19 Caleb's inheritance in Judah; he gives his daughter to his nephew to wed.
1314. Joshua 15:20-62 Further outline of Judah's territory in Canaan.
1315. Joshua 15:63 Jebusites, inhabitants of Jerusalem, could not be driven out.
1316. Joshua 16:1-9 Territory inheritance of Joseph's sons Manasseh and Ephraim.
1317. Joshua 16:10 Canaanites in Ephraim's inheritance could not be driven out.
1318. Joshua 17:1-2 Further inheritance for tribe of Manasseh.
1319. Joshua 17:3-6 Zelophehad, distant grandson of Manasseh had only daughters, which asked for and were given an inheritance.
1320. Joshua 17:7-18 There is a conflict on the land of Joseph; his family is given an extra mountain.
1321. Joshua 18:1 Israel assembles at Shiloh; they set up the Tabernacle there.
1322. Joshua 18:2-5 Tribes without land are ordered by Joshua to define their borders (+V7).
1323. Joshua 18:6 Joshua takes the outlines given by seven tribes and casts lots to settle their conflicts.
1324. Joshua 18:10-28 Joshua casts lot and settles a dispute of the territory of the tribe of Benjamin.
1325. Joshua 19:1-9 The tribe of Simeon is given an inheritance land within the land of the tribe of Judah.

1326. Joshua 19:10-16 The tribe of Zebulun's land and cities are given approval.
1327. Joshua 19:17-23 The tribe of Issachar's land and cities are given approval.
1328. Joshua 19:24-31 The tribe of Asher's land and cities are given approval.
1329. Joshua 19:32-39 The tribe of Naphtali's land and cities are given approval.
1330. Joshua 19:40-48 The tribe of Dan's land and cities are given approval but they fight for more.
1331. Joshua 19:49-50 Joshua is given the inheritance city of Timnath-serah in Mt. Ephraim.
1332. Joshua 19:51 All inheritances are completed by Eleazar the Priest and Joshua at Shiloh.
1333. Joshua 20:1-6 Cities of Refuge and their conditions are explained.
1334. Joshua 20:7-9 Cities of Refuge are identified.
1335. Joshua 21:1-42 Cities given to Levites as Priest Cities throughout each tribe.
1336. Joshua 21:43-45 End of inheritance brings peace, rest, and wealth to Israel.
1337. Joshua 22:1-6 Joshua sends Reubenites, Gadites, and Half Tribe of Manasseh home to the east side of the Jordan River.
1338. Joshua 22:7-9 Blessings go with all tribes sent to the east side of the Jordan River.
1339. Joshua 22:10 The East Jordan tribes build themselves an altar to God; it is an abomination.
1340. Joshua 22:11-12 Israel prepares to go to war with her East Jordan River tribes.

1341. Joshua 22:13-20 Eleazar, Israel's Priest and ten tribes with their princes go and chastise the East Jordan tribes.
1342. Joshua 22:21-34 The East Jordan River tribes (Gilead) explain their altar; all is resolved; Israel is happy.
1343. Joshua 23:1-16 Joshua is aged, calls Israel together, and tells them of their pitfalls and how to live.
1344. Joshua 24:1-2 Joshua tells Israel of "other side of flood" where God was not worshipped.
1345. Joshua 24:3 Joshua tells Israel of God calling Abraham "from the other side of the flood."
1346. Joshua 24:3-11 God speaks through Joshua of leading and history of Israel.
1347. Joshua 24:12 God speaks again of sending hornets to drive out the Canaanite enemies.
1348. Joshua 24:13-15 God says, "Choose whom you will serve" and tells of idol worshippers on the other side of the flood.
1349. Joshua 24:16-20 Joshua tells Israel God will destroy them if they turn from Him.
1350. Joshua 24:21-26 Joshua restates God's covenant with Israel, writes a book, and sets up great stones.
1351. Joshua 24:27-28 Joshua allows the people of Israel to depart to their inheritances.
1352. Joshua 24:29 Joshua dies at 110 years old.
1353. Joshua 24:30-32 Joshua is buried at Timnath-serah; Joseph's bones are buried at Shechem.
1354. Joshua 24:33 Priest Eleazar, son of Aaron, dies and is buried on Mt. Ephraim.
