

NEHEMIAH

2454. Nehemiah 1:1-11 Nehemiah hears of the distress of Jews in Judah and bad condition of Jerusalem City.
2455. Nehemiah 2:1-5 Nehemiah is cupbearer to King Artaxerxes of Persia and shows sadness; asked, he tells his king of torn down Jerusalem.
2456. Nehemiah 2:6-8 King Artaxerxes gives Nehemiah letters and permission to rebuild the city of Jerusalem, Judah.
2457. Nehemiah 2:9-10 Nehemiah gives letters to “Governors beyond River;” they are mad, but Nehemiah is safe because soldiers are sent from Persia with him for protection.
2458. Nehemiah 2:11-20 Nehemiah surveys Jerusalem City and begins to rebuild; his enemies aggravate and threaten him.
2459. Nehemiah 3:1-32 Nehemiah has several groups of workers who work side by side, each repairing parts of the city wall.
2460. Nehemiah 4:1-8 Enemy governors mock the Jewish builders, and then become alarmed when large portions of the wall are rebuilt.
2461. Nehemiah 4:9-18 Jews carry weapons while rebuilding and place guards all around the city (same as 1947-1948 when they returned to Palestine and began farming and irrigating the desert areas before they built an army to protect them, which continues to the present day).
2462. Nehemiah 4:19-23 A trumpeter stands by to signal any danger; Jews never undress or leave their weapons.
2463. Nehemiah 5:1-14 The Jews complain over fees and taxes for construction; Nehemiah straightens them out.
2464. Nehemiah 5:15-19 Nehemiah appoints a Governor of Judah for twelve years, self sustained.

2465. Nehemiah 6:1-19 The enemy tries to seduce Nehemiah from the city, threatening to report bad things to King Artaxerxes, though untrue.
2466. Nehemiah 7:1-4 The Jerusalem walls are completed but no houses are yet built; Nehemiah places his brother as head of the city.
2467. Nehemiah 7:5-73 The Book of Genealogy of the Jews taken captive to Babylon is reviewed.
2468. Nehemiah 8:1-13 Ezra reads the Book of Law before the city's Watergate; all stand and weep.
2469. Nehemiah 8:14-18 Ezra reads the Law of Booths; they all build booths and Ezra reads during next seven days, then they observe a Solemn Assembly.
2470. Nehemiah 9:1-38 The Jews separate, read the law, and give the story of the exodus, Israelites forty-year wilderness journey, wearing the same clothes and the same shoes the entire time.
2471. Nehemiah 10:1-39 The Jews seal their personal covenant with God with duties and gifts.
2472. Nehemiah 11:1-36 The Jews cast lots to see what tenth of them will live in the city of Jerusalem with the leaders; the rest will live in other cities.
2473. Nehemiah 12:1-26 Lists of Priests and Levites with their genealogy from the captivity.
2474. Nehemiah 12:27-47 Levite positions and duties, singers, instrumentalists, treasurers, etc.
2475. Nehemiah 13:1-3 The Jews read the Book of Moses on separation of Jews, exiling others from the congregation.
2476. Nehemiah 13:4-14 Nehemiah visits King Artaxerxes again; he returns to Jerusalem to find bad Levites in the Temple.

2477. Nehemiah 13:15-22 Nehemiah finds merchant violations of the Sabbath and closes the gates on the Sabbath day to keep them out.
2478. Nehemiah 13:23-25 Nehemiah chastises Jews who married non-Jews with their mixed languages; he punishes them.
2479. Nehemiah 13:26-31 Nehemiah recalls the sins of Solomon in marrying heathen wives, even priests with heathen wives; he casts them out and purifies the priesthood.
