803. Numbers 1:1 Israel has been out of Egypt one year, one month, and one day.

EARTH AGE IS 2,667 YEARS + TWO MONTHS AND 23 DAYS

804. Numbers 1:2-3 God tells Moses to take census of Israel from 20 years old and up.

805. Numbers 1:4-15 God names military leaders of each tribe of Israel formerly princes and leaders of thousands.

806. Numbers 1:17-20 Each Israeli tribe's army is chosen of those over 20 years old.

807. Numbers 1:21 Reuben's army is 46,500 men strong.

808. Numbers 1:22-23 Simeon's army is 59,300 men strong.

809. Numbers 1:24-25 Gad's army is 45,650 men strong.

810. Numbers 1:26-27 Judah's army is 74,600 men strong.

811. Numbers 1:28-29 Issachar's army is 54,400 men strong.

812. Numbers 1:30-31 Zebulun's army is 57,400 men strong.

813. Numbers 1:32-33 Joseph's tribe had two armies – son Ephraim's army is 40,500 men strong.

814. Numbers 1:34-35 Joseph's second son Manasseh's army is 32,200 men strong.

815. Numbers 1:36-37 Benjamin's army is 35,400 men strong.

816. Numbers 1:38-39 Dan's army is 62,700 men strong.

817. Numbers 1:40-41 Asher's army is 41,500 men strong.

818. Numbers 1:42-43 Naphtali's army is 53,400 men strong.

819. Numbers 1:47-49 Israel's tribe of Levi is exempt, not numbered with their armies.

820. Numbers 1:50 Levites must transport the tabernacle and camp around it.
821. Numbers 1:51-54 Levites will set up and tear down the tabernacle; any stranger found near the tabernacle will be put to death.
822. Numbers 2:1-34 Spaces around Tabernacle for each army and tribe with their ensign standards.
823. Numbers 3:1-13 God presents Levites; says He will also have the first male of each family.
824. Numbers 3:14-16 God orders numbering of Levites from a month old and upward, males only.
825. Numbers 3:17-31 Levi's sons and families by number of males and their duties at the tabernacle.
826. Numbers 3:32 Aaron's son Eleazer is named Chief Priest.
827. Numbers 3:38 Aaron and Moses must camp in front of the Tabernacle on the east side.
828. Numbers 3:39 Levites are numbered at 22,000, all males over one month old.
829. Numbers 3:40-43 God has Moses number firstborns over one month old of Israel.

NUMBER OF ISRAELI FAMILIES – 22,260

830. Numbers 3:44-51 God has Moses tax each Israeli firstborn 5 shekels to give to the Levites for religious service.
831. Numbers 4:1-4 God chooses sons of Kohath (Levites) 30 to 50 years of age to handle "Most Holy Things."
832. Numbers 4:5-6 Taking down the Tabernacle veil, covering the ark with veil and blue cloth.
833. Numbers 4:7-15 Covering of sanctuary items: table, altar, etc. with furs and blue cloth.

834. Numbers 4:15-16 Kohathites carry the Tabernacle; Eleazarites handle the oil, incense, bread, and vessels.
835. Numbers 4:17-20 Protecting the Korathites from dying when touching Holy Things.
836. Numbers 4:22-28 Gershonites (Levites) from 30 to 50 years old are tasked to carry parts of the Tabernacle.
837. Numbers 4:29-33 Merarites (Levites) from 30 to 50 years old are tasked to haul the temple boards, sockets, etc.
838. Numbers 4:34-37 Kohathites 30 to 50 years of age are numbered at 2,750 men.
839. Numbers 4:38-41 Gershonites 30 to 50 years of age are numbered at 2,630 men.
840. Numbers 4:42-45 Merarites 30 to 50 years of age are numbered at 3,200 men.
841. Numbers 4:46-49 Total number of Levites 30 to 50 years of age in this service – 8,580.
842. Numbers 5:1-4 God has Israel put all unclean (lepers, those with issues of blood or infection, and those who have touched the dead) out of the camp.
843. Numbers 5:5-10 Penalty for fornication.
844. Numbers 5:11-22 Curse for adulteress: bitter water, belly swelling, and thy thigh to rot.
845. Numbers 5:23-31 Law of jealousies.
846. Numbers 6:1-4 Vow of a Nazarite: no wine, vinegar, grapes, and no kernals.
847. Numbers 6:5 Vow of a Nazarite: no cutting of hair.
848. Numbers 6:6-8 Vow of a Nazarite: can touch no dead body.

849. Numbers 6:9-12 If the dead is touched accidentally, one who touched the dead must shave his head on the 7th day and make a ritual atonement.
850. Numbers 6:13-21 Law of the Nazarite: make offerings and burn hair on the altar fire.
851. Numbers 6:22-27 God gives the exact words for blessing the children of Israel.
852. Numbers 7:1-9 God instructs Moses to provide wagons to transport the Tabernacle.
853. Numbers 7:10-88 Israel tribes make their special offerings to the Tabernacle and anointing the altar.
854. Numbers 7:89 Moses goes into the Tabernacle and God speaks to him from the Mercy Seat.
855. Numbers 8:6-7 Cleansing the Levites – entire body had to be shaved.
856. Numbers 8:13 Moses offering the Levites at the altar, all but burning.
857. Numbers 8:24-26 Levites served only from 25 to 50 years of age; at age 50 Levites had mandatory retirement.
858. Numbers 9:5 Moses told to keep the Passover on the 14th day of the first month.
859. Numbers 9:6-14 Unclean by touching the dead and strangers may observe Passover.
860. Numbers 9:15-23 No traveling of Israel is allowed while God is in the cloud on the Tabernacle; sometimes for a year or more.
861. Numbers 10:1-10 God has Israel to make two trumpets to blow for assembly or alarm.
862. Numbers 10:11-12 Cloud on Tabernacle is lifted after one year, one month, and twelve days and Israel travels from Sinai to Paran.

863. Numbers 10:13-28 Names of tribe army heads and their order for traveling; the Tabernacle traveled fourth in the procession.
864. Numbers 10:29-32 Moses invites his brother-in-law and his wife's people to go with them to Canaan.
865. Numbers 10:33-36 Israel travels 3 days with the Ark carried before them.
866. Numbers 11:1-3 Israel complains; God sends fire and consumes those on the outside of the camp at Taberah.
867. Numbers 11:4-6 Israelites complain for meat, melons, onions, etc.
868. Numbers 11:7 Manna's composition was like coriander seed and colored like bdellium.
869. Numbers 11:8-9 How manna was collected and prepared; manna had the taste of fresh oil.
870. Numbers 11:10-15 Moses is upset with too much pressure from the people of Israel; he complains to God.
871. Numbers 11:16-17 God calls Moses and 70 elders to the Tabernacle and divides responsibilities.
872. Numbers 11:18-21 God is angry, says He will send meat and most will eat "until it comes out of your nostrils."
873. Numbers 11:22-23 Israel is not allowed to eat their herds for meat.
874. Numbers 11:24-30 God comes in a cloud and speaks to Israel's elders; many of them prophesy.
875. Numbers 11:31-32 Quail fall around the camp and are gathered and eaten.
876. Numbers 11:33 God is angry, sends plague on Israel while they are eating quail.

877. Numbers 11:34 Dead Israelites that lusted for meat and killed are buried at Kibroth-hattaavah.
878. Numbers 11:35 Israel journeys from Kibroth-hattaavah to Hazeroth.
879. Numbers 12:1 Moses marries a black Ethiopian woman; Miriam and Aaron are angry over it.
880. Numbers 12:2 Miriam and Aaron are jealous and covet Moses' relationship with God, feel they have the same right.
881. Numbers 12:3 Moses was the meekest man on earth.
882. Numbers 12:4-9 God calls for and speaks to Miriam and Aaron; God is very angry with them and chastises them severely.
883. Numbers 12:10-15 Miriam becomes leprous; Moses and Aaron beg God to remove it; God removes the leprosy after one week.
884. Numbers 12:16 After Miriam is cured, Israel journeyed to the Wilderness of Paran.
885. Numbers 13:1-2 God tells Moses to send spies into Canaan to analyze it; Caleb is 45 years old at that time.
886. Numbers 13:3-16 One head from each Israeli tribe is chosen to spy out Canaan.
887. Numbers 13:17-22 Israel's spies journey to Hebron where the Children of Anak (giants) live.
888. Numbers 13:23-25 Israeli spies cut a branch of grapes from Canaan and return to camp after 40 days.
889. Numbers 13:26-30 Report of Israel's spies is given; Caleb wants to attack Canaan immediately.
890. Numbers 13:31-33 Other Israeli spies say no to attack, say the giants and Canaanites will defeat Israel.

891. Numbers 14:1-10 People of Israel are afraid; Joshua and Caleb speak bravely; Israel complains and wants to stone them.
892. Numbers 14:11-17 Moses begs God not to kill Israelites; he says it will make a bad story about the failure of the Exodus.
893. Numbers 14:18 God says He will pass the iniquity of Israel's fathers down to the 3rd and 4th generation.
894. Numbers 14:19-23 God says that those who have provoked Him will not reach Canaan.
895. Numbers 14:24-28 God approves of Caleb and Joshua, has Israel travel to the Red Sea.
896. Numbers 14:29-37 God says all of Israel over 20 years old will die in the wilderness and all spies except Joshua and Caleb will die.
897. Numbers 14:38-45 God tells Israel He is not with them; the Amalekites and Canaanites attack and slaughter many Israelites.
898. Numbers 15:1-16 God orders an offering to be made when Israel enters Canaan and for each Israeli born there.
899. Numbers 15:17-31 God's word to Israel on Heave Offerings, Sin Offerings, intentional sin, and expulsion.
900. Numbers 15:32-36 A man of Israel is found gathering sticks on the Sabbath and is stoned to death.
901. Numbers 15:38-41 God has Israelites sew fringes on the bottoms and borders of their garmets.
902. Numbers 16:1-4 Korah, great grandson of Levi and his band make insurrection against Moses.
903. Numbers 16:5-7 Moses tells the band (Sons of Levi) to let God decide the leadership of Israel.
904. Numbers 16:8-19 Moses chastises Korah and Sons of Levi, Sons of Eliab, and Sons of Reuben (V1).

905. Numbers 16:20-22 Insurrectionists are before God; God prepares to kill them; Moses begs for their lives.
906. Numbers 16:23-30 God tells Moses to separate good Israelites from the insurrectionist band (V1).
907. Numbers 16:31-35 God opens the earth and it swallows most of the insurrectionists; the rest are burned with God's fire.
908. Numbers 16:36-40 God orders that the censors of the insurrectionist band be melted and made into a covering for the altar.
909. Numbers 16:41-45 The next day Israel murmurs against Moses; God starts to kill them; Moses begs for their lives.
910. Numbers 16:46-47 The plague begins; Moses has Aaron run among Israel with a censor of incense for atonement, hoping to stay the plague.
911. Numbers 16:48-50 Aaron stands between the dead and the living; the plague kills 14,700 Israelis.
912. Numbers 17:1-4 God has Israel make rods with names of each tribe inscribed on each.
913. Numbers 17:5-13 Aaron's rod blooms; Israelis are afraid for their lives.
914. Numbers 18:1-19 God gives to Aaron instructions for the care of the sanctuary and proper attitudes.
915. Numbers 18:20-24 God tells Aaron that the Levite's only inheritance will be the Tabernacle.
916. Numbers 18:25-32 The tithe from Israel and Heave Offerings go to the Levites.
917. Numbers 19:1-10 Special Red Heifer Offering, washing from exposure, and purification instructions given Israel.

918. Numbers 19:11 When one touches the body of a dead man, the one touching him is unclean for 7 days and must receive purification.
919. Numbers 19:12-19 To purify, a clean person takes hyssop, dips it in water, and sprinkles it on the unclean person.
920. Numbers 19:20-22 An Israeli, uncleansed, shall be cut off from the congregation.
921. Numbers 20:1 Israel travels into the Desert of Zin to Kadesh – Miriam dies there and is buried.
922. Numbers 20:2-6 Israel runs out of water in the desert; wishes to be back in Egypt.
923. Numbers 20:7-11 God gathers the congregation, has Moses strike a rock, and water gushes out.
924. Numbers 20:12 God tells Moses and Aaron that the congregation shall not enter Canaan.
925. Numbers 20:14 Moses sends messengers into Edom (Esau) to reason with them.
926. Numbers 20:15-17 Moses tells Edom about the Egyptian captivity, the exodus, and Israel's plight since.
927. Numbers 20:18-21 Edom refuses Israel passage through their land and threatens war.
928. Numbers 20:22 Israel travels from Kadesh, Zin to Mount Hor.
929. Numbers 20:23-24 God tells Moses that Aaron will die in the wilderness for his rebellion at Meribah.
930. Numbers 20:25-29 God tells Moses to strip Aaron's garments off and put them on Eleazar, Aaron's son; Aaron dies on Mount Hor.
931. Numbers 21:1-3 King Arad of Canaan fights Israel; Israel destroys all cities at Hormah.

932. Numbers 21:4-5 Israel travels from Mt. Hor by the Red Sea; people of Israel are mad about the exodus and the manna.
933. Numbers 21:6-9 God sends fiery serpents upon Israel, many die; Moses makes a brass serpent; those bitten may look upon it and live.
934. Numbers 21:10-16 Israel journeys to Oboth, then to Ijeabarim, Zared, Arnon, Ar, Beer, and on to Moab (people of Lot's grand-children).
935. Numbers 21:17-18 Israel sings the song of a Water Well; then dig the well.
936. Numbers 21:18-20 Israel travels from the wilderness to Mattanah, Nahaliel, Bamoth, Pishgah, and Jeshimon.
937. Numbers 21:21-22 Israel asks King Sihon of the Amorites for passage through their land.
938. Numbers 21:23-25 Israel defeats the Amorites to the border of Ammon and dwell at Heshbon.
939. Numbers 21:26 Heshbon is King Sihon's city he had fought for and taken from Moab along with all of the land to Arnon.
940. Numbers 21:27-30 Songs written and sung about the defeat of Moab and Heshbon.
941. Numbers 21:31-32 Israel dwells in the land of the Amorites, sends spy to Jaazer, and drives out the Amorites there.
942. Numbers 21:33-35 Israel fights Og, King of Bashan at Edrei, kill all humans there, and possess the land.
943. Numbers 22:1 Israel travels to the Plains of Moab by the Jordan River across from Jericho.
944. Numbers 22:2-8 Balak of Moab is afraid of Israel and sends for help from Balaam of Pethor.
945. Numbers 22:9-12 God speaks to Balaam and tells him that Israel is sacred, that he is not to fight them.

946. Numbers 22:13-19 Balaam tells Balak that God says no to a mutual armistice and will ask God for more instructions.
947. Numbers 22:20-21 God tells Balaam to go with the Moabites; he rides on a donkey.
948. Numbers 22:22-27 God is mad and sends an angel with a sword to block Balaam's path; the donkey balks at seeing the angel that Balaam could not see; Balaam beats the donkey.
949. Numbers 22:28-30 God has the donkey speak to Balaam.
950. Numbers 22:31-34 Balaam is allowed to see the angel with the sword; the angel tells him that he barely missed death. The donkey had saved him.
951. Numbers 22:35-41 Angel sends Balaam to see Balak; he is taken to places of Baal at Kirjath-huzoth.
952. Numbers 23:1-3 Balaam, Balak, and Moab princes make and use altars against Israel.
953. Numbers 23:4-12 Balak chastises Balaam for not cursing Israel.
954. Numbers 23:13-15 Balak and Balaam build altars on top of Mt. Pisgah.
955. Numbers 23:16-24 God speaks to Balaam again, tells him that Israel is mighty in strength like the unicorn.
956. Numbers 23:25-30 Balak and Balaam try again to curse Israel with 7 altars on Mt. Peor.
957. Numbers 24:1-9 Balaam sings enchantments declaring Israel's strength and blessedness.
958. Numbers 24:10-11 Balak sends Balaam away with chastisement for not cursing Israel.
959. Numbers 24:12-25 Balaam tells Balak how Israel will destroy and possess all of Canaan.

960. Numbers 25:1-3 Israel abides in Shittim and commits whoredoms with Moab, worshipping Baal-peor gods.
961. Numbers 25:4-5 God orders Moses to cut off the heads of all Baal-peor worshippers and hang each in the sun.
962. Numbers 25:6-8 An Israelite man takes a Midianitish woman to his tent; Phinehas, Eleazar's son spears both of them to death.
963. Numbers 25:8-9 Plague comes on Israel and is stayed after 24 thousand Israelites die.
964. Numbers 25:10-15 Phinehas, son of Eleazar, receives God's Covenant of Peace and Everlasting Priesthood.
965. Numbers 25:16-18 God tells Moses to slay all Midianites.
966. Numbers 26:1-65 God has Moses and Eleazar number Israel above 20 years old with the names from each tribe; total number is 601,730 persons.
967. Numbers 27:1-8 Great + granddaughters of Joseph whose fathers are dead, ask for and get an inheritance in Canaan.
968. Numbers 27:8-11 How an inheritance is passed down where there are no sons or daughters.
969. Numbers 27:12-14 God tells Moses to go to Mt. Abarim to die because he rebelled at the Desert of Zin.
970. Numbers 27:15-23 Moses asks that Joshua lead Israel, God approves, and hands are laid on Joshua before Eleazar the Priest.
971. Numbers 28:1-31 Law and times of various offerings, burnt, etc.
972. Numbers 29:1-40 Holy Convocation, days and offerings, set feasts, etc.
973. Numbers 30:1-16 Making vows and binding oaths by man, wife, daughter, widow, and divorcee.

974. Numbers 31:1-5 God tells Moses to destroy Midian with one thousand men from each tribe of Israel.
975. Numbers 31:6 Phinehas the priest is sent to Israel's wars with holy instruments and trumpets to blow.
976. Numbers 31:7-8 Israel slays all males of Midian and Kings Evi, Rekem, Zur, Hur, Reba, and Balaam.
977. Numbers 31:9 Israel takes captive all Midian women and children, all flocks and goods.
978. Numbers 31:12 Israel burns all Midian cities and castles and brings the spoil to the Plains of Moab.
979. Numbers 31:13-17 Moses is mad about the captives and has all non-virgin women and all male children killed.
980. Numbers 31:18 Israeli Army is told to keep the Midian virgins for themselves.
981. Numbers 31:19-24 Purifying methods for soldiers, captives, and goods.
982. Numbers 31:25-54 Dividing the spoils taken from the Midianites.
983. Numbers 31:35 Number of Midian virgins taken captive was 32,000.
984. Numbers 32:1-5 Reuben and Gad tribes want to stay on the east side of the Jordan River across from Jericho.
985. Numbers 32:6-9 Moses is angry because Reuben and Gad would escape from fighting Canaan.
986. Numbers 32:10-16 God is angry at Israel for disobedience – all over age 20 at time of the exodus will wander 40 years and not enter Canaan.
987. Numbers 32:17-32 Tribes of Reuben and Gad settle in Gilead, across the Jordan River from Jericho, but agree to go to share the fight against Canaan.

988. Numbers 32:23 Moses tells Reuben and Gad, “If you don’t go (with Israel to fight Canaan), be sure your sins will find you out.”
989. Numbers 32:33 Moses gives Reuben, Gad, and the Half Tribe of Manasseh the Kingdoms of Sihon and Og.
990. Numbers 32:34-42 Cities and possessions of Reuben, Gad, and Half Tribe of Manasseh who possess the land of Gilead.
991. Numbers 33:1-49 Entire routing and camping of Israel for 40 years from Egypt to Edom (Esau).
992. Numbers 33:4 The Egyptians buried all firstborns of their families.
993. Numbers 33:38-39 Aaron dies on Mt. Hor exactly 40 years and one day out of Egypt; he is 123 years old (83 years old at beginning of exodus); Moses is 120 years old.

EARTH AGE IS 2,706 YEARS + 2 MONTHS AND 23 DAYS

994. Numbers 33:51-53 Israel ordered to cross the Jordan River, destroy the Canaanites, their pictures, molten images, and high places.
995. Numbers 33:54 God orders Israel to divide Canaanland according to the size of each of the 10 tribes (Reuben, Gad, and Half Tribe of Manasseh are across the Jordan River east of Canaan.
996. Numbers 33:55-56 God orders Israel to kill or drive out all Canaanites or “they will vex you and destroy you.”
997. Numbers 34:1-12 God gives the exact borders of the land Israel is to inherit.
998. Numbers 34:13 Only 9 and 1/2 tribes of Israel are to possess the land of inheritance.
999. Numbers 34:14-15 2 and 1/2 tribes, Reuben, Gad, and Half tribe of Manasseh possess the land across the Jordan River.

1000. Numbers 34:17-29 Eleazar, Joshua, + one prince from each tribe are chosen to divide the land of Canaan.
1001. Numbers 35:1-5 Levites (tribe) are given 48 cities (V7) + a 1,000 cubit border (suburbs) for living and livestock.
1002. Numbers 35:6 Six Refuge Cities are chosen among the 48 Levite cities where those who have killed another may flee.
1003. Numbers 35:8 Larger tribes of Israel are given more cities and each is ordered to give some cities to the Levites.
1004. Numbers 35:10-15 Of the 6 “Refuge Cities” 3 must be on the east side of the Jordan River and 3 on the west side.
1005. Numbers 35:16-21 Cases of killings that do not qualify for the refuge cities.
1006. Numbers 35:19 Revenger (kin) of victim of murder shall slay the murderer.
1007. Numbers 35:22-25 Accidental killing of a person, trial, and refuge city restrictions.
1008. Numbers 35:26-29 The avenger may kill person in refuge if he is found outside the refuge city.
1009. Numbers 35:28 A person in refuge is free after the death of the reigning high priest.
1010. Numbers 35:30 There must be more than one witness to condemn a murderer.
1011. Numbers 35:33 Shed blood of victim pollutes the land; the blood of the one who did the killing can only cleanse it.
1012. Numbers 36:1-13 Manasseh tribe daughters may keep their inheritance but must marry within their own tribe.

1013. Numbers 36:7

No inheritance may transfer from one tribe to another.
