

## SECOND CHRONICLES

2329. Second Chronicles 1:1-6 King Solomon speaks; the Tabernacle is at Gibeon and the Ark is at Jerusalem in a tent.
2330. Second Chronicles 1:7-17 Solomon speaks to God; God's promises to him of wisdom, power, and riches.
2331. Second Chronicles 2:1-2 Solomon picks one hundred fifty-three thousand workers to hew stone and carry materials for the Temple.
2332. Second Chronicles 2:3-18 King Solomon and King Hiram (formerly Hiram) of Tyre agree on timbers and skilled workers for the Temple.
2333. Second Chronicles 3:1-17 Solomon begins building the Temple; dimensions and furnishings.
2334. Second Chronicles 4:1-22 More of building the Temple; King Hiram's part in casting the metals in the clay of Jordan.
2335. Second Chronicles 5:1-14 The Temple is finished, the Ark is brought in (with only the stone tablets), ceremonies are conducted, and a cloud fills the Temple.
2336. Second Chronicles 6:1-27 King Solomon preaches to Israel and prays the same prayer as Second Chronicles 7:14.
2337. Second Chronicles 6:28-42 Solomon continues to pray before the people of instances to "hear from heaven."
2338. Second Chronicles 7:1-9 Fire comes down from heaven and burns the sacrifices and the people bow to God.
2339. Second Chronicles 7:10-22 King Solomon dismisses the congregation; God comes and speaks to him Second Chronicles 7:14 and a warning about false gods.
2340. Second Chronicles 8:1-10 At the end of twenty years, Solomon's acquisitions of cities and of heathen peoples.

2341. Second Chronicles 8:11-18 King Solomon brings his Egyptian wife to Jerusalem, appoints priests, and attains riches.
2342. Second Chronicles 9:1 The Queen of Sheba (Ethiopia) visits King Solomon, communes, and brings gifts to him.
2343. Second Chronicles 9:2-12 King Solomon answers all of the Queen of Sheba's questions and she is amazed and gives gifts.
2344. Second Chronicles 9:13-20 Solomon receives gold from Arabian Kings and makes gold shields and vessels and an ivory throne.
2345. Second Chronicles 9:21 Solomon and King Hiram of Tyre send ships to bring gold, silver, apes, and peacocks to Israel.
2346. Second Chronicles 9:22-31 King Solomon is the world's richest and wisest leader; all kings seek to hear him and bring mules for his stables; Solomon reigns for forty years.
2347. Second Chronicles 10:1 Rehoboam, son of Solomon, goes to Shechem to be crowned King of Israel.
2348. Second Chronicles 10:2-4 Jeroboam is returned from Egyptian exile by Solomon and asks for a lighter yoke.
2349. Second Chronicles 10:5-15 King Rehoboam confers with his old and young advisors and makes the yoke harder on Israel's people.
2350. Second Chronicles 10:16-19 The Israeli people rebel; Rehoboam rules only in Judah cities and his taxman is stoned.
2351. Second Chronicles 11:1-4 King Rehoboam raises a one hundred and eighty thousand man army to fight Jeroboam and Israel; Shemiah, God's man says, "God says 'No'."
2352. Second Chronicles 11:5-15 All Levites return to Judah; Jeroboam sets up heathen priests and devils in Israel.

2353. Second Chronicles 11:16-23 King Rehoboam was godly earlier in his reign, took wives from the family, had eighteen wives and sixty concubines and had twenty-eight sons and sixty daughters; he wanted to make Abijah, grandson of Absalom king.
2354. Second Chronicles 12:1-4 King Rehoboam turns bad and Shishak, King of Egypt, with the Lubims, Sukkiims, and Ethiopians come against him.
2355. Second Chronicles 12:5-10 King Shishak of Egypt takes Judah and all of its treasures but God allows for Jerusalem's transgressions.
2356. Second Chronicles 12:11-16 King Rehoboam is able to keep Jerusalem but is a bad king; he dies and his son, Abijah reigns.
2357. Second Chronicles 13:1-5 King Abijah of Judah goes against King Jeroboam of Israel and speaks to him about God's "Salt Covenant" with King David being king of all (Judah and Israel).
2358. Second Chronicles 13:6-12 King Abijah of Judah continues to accuse Israel of worshipping Baal and of transgressions against God.
2359. Second Chronicles 13:13-22 Israel surrounds Judah for war; King Abijah and Judah call on God and He allows them to defeat Israel, killing five hundred thousand Israeli soldiers; King Jeroboam of Israel dies.
2360. Second Chronicles 14:1-8 King Abijah of Judah dies and his son Asa is King of Judah; he is a good king and destroys Judah's idols.
2361. Second Chronicles 14:9-15 King Asa of Judah is attacked by Ethiopia; he defeats them and takes their spoil.
2362. Second Chronicles 15:1-19 Prophet Azariah preaches to King Asa; he is a good king and reigns for thirty-five years.

2363. Second Chronicles 16:1-6 King Baasha, new King of Israel, besieges Judah; King Asa of Judah calls upon King Ben-hadad of Syria for help; Israel is defeated but God is angry because Judah did not call upon Him.
2364. Second Chronicles 16:7-11 Seer (Prophet) Hanani chastises King Asa; he becomes angry and imprisons the seer in his rage.
2365. Second Chronicles 16:12-14 King Asa of Judah becomes crippled in his feet in his thirty-ninth year of reigning; he seeks physicians but is not healed, does not seek God, and dies.
2366. Second Chronicles 17:1-10 King Jehoshaphat is new King of Judah and fortifies Judah; he schools all of Judah in the Book of the Law.
2367. Second Chronicles 17:11-19 The Philistines and Arabians bring King Jehoshaphat gifts; he had an army of one million, eighty thousand men.
2368. Second Chronicles 18:1-34 King Jehoshaphat of Judah joins with King Ahab of Israel against Syria; a group of prophets say it is okay but Prophet Micaiah says no; they go anyway and King Ahab, disguised, is hit by an arrow and dies.
2369. Second Chronicles 19:1-4 Seer (Prophet) Jehu chastises King Jehoshaphat for helping the ungodly.
2370. Second Chronicles 19:5-11 King Jehoshaphat sets Judges in Judah's cities, orders that they "take no bribes" and sets overseers.
2371. Second Chronicles 20:1-19 Moab, Ammon, and Ammonites come against Judah; Prophet Jahaziel says God will defend them.
2372. Second Chronicles 20:20-25 God fights with King Jehoshaphat against his enemies, kills them, and strips the valuables from the enemy's bodies.

2373. Second Chronicles 20:26-34 God's fear is on all countries against Judah; King Jehoshaphat reigns for twenty-five years.
2374. Second Chronicles 20:35-37 King Jehoshaphat of Judah joins King Ahaziah of Israel, they build ships, and God sinks them.
2375. Second Chronicles 21:1-7 King Jehoram, new King of Judah, kills his brothers and marries King Ahab's daughter.
2376. Second Chronicles 21:8-10 The Edomites revolt under Judah and make a king for themselves; they are defeated; Libnah also revolts against Judah.
2377. Second Chronicles 21:11-15 King Jehoram sets up idols in Judah; Prophet Elijah says a plague will come and his bowels will fall out.
2378. Second Chronicles 21:16-17 God stirs up the Philistines and Arabians against Judah; they come and take Judah's jewels and sons.
2379. Second Chronicles 21:18-20 His bowels kill King Jehoram; he reigned eight years and is not buried in the sepulchre of kings.
2380. Second Chronicles 22:1-2 The Arabians kill all of the sons of Jehoram but the youngest, Ahaziah, age forty-two, who reigned one year over Judah.
2381. Second Chronicles 22:3-6 King Ahaziah of Judah joins King Jehoram of Israel against Syria; Jehoram is wounded and visited by King Azariah.
2382. Second Chronicles 22:7-8 God sends Army Chief Jehu against the House of Ahab, finds Ahaziah there, and slays the Princes of Judah.
2383. Second Chronicles 22:9-10 Jehu slays King Ahaziah; his mother, Queen Athaliah kills the seed royal and becomes Queen of Judah.
2384. Second Chronicles 22:11-12 King Ahaziah's sister, Jehoshabeath hides his son, Joash for six years.

2385. Second Chronicles 23:1-10 Priest Jehoida arms the Levites, who encompass Joash, and make him King of Judah.
2386. Second Chronicles 23:11-16 Queen Athaliah of Judah cries, “treason!” and is taken from the city and slain
2387. Second Chronicles 23:17-21 House of Baal and Grove priests are destroyed; Priest Jehoida puts Joash on the throne of Judah in Jerusalem.
2388. Second Chronicles 24:1-3 King Joash, age seven, reigns over Judah for forty years led by Priest Jehoida.
2389. Second Chronicles 24:4-14 King Joash raised money and rebuilt the temple destroyed by Queen Athaliah and her sons.
2390. Second Chronicles 24:15-19 Priest Jehoida dies and is buried with the kings; the princes of Judah turn back to Baal.
2391. Second Chronicles 24:20-27 Priest Jehoida’s son Zechariah preaches against Judah’s princes and is stoned; Syria takes all; servants of Judah kill King Joash.
2392. Second Chronicles 25:1-4 King Amaziah, age twenty, son of King Joash reigns over Judah for twenty-nine years and kills all of the servants who killed King Joash, but not their children.
2393. Second Chronicles 25:5-10 King Amaziah builds a great three hundred thousand man Army of Judah and hires one hundred thousand from Israel but God says no to the army from Israel and they return home angry.
2394. Second Chronicles 25:11-13 King Amaziah attacks Sier, kills ten thousand and throws ten thousand off a cliff; the one hundred thousand-man army of Israel attacks Judah.
2395. Second Chronicles 25:14-16 King Amaziah brings the Sier idols to Judah and worships them; God sends a prophet to him and he repents.

2396. Second Chronicles 25:17-22 King Amaziah wars with King Joash of Israel; Judah is defeated.
2397. Second Chronicles 25:23-24 King Joash of Israel tears down the walls of Jerusalem and takes their valuables to Samaria.
2398. Second Chronicles 25:25-28 King Amaziah of Judah is executed by Judah in Lachish and is buried in Jerusalem.
2399. Second Chronicles 26:1-5 King Uzziah, age sixteen, reigns over Judah for fifty-two years; he does good, helped by God's Priest Zechariah II.
2400. Second Chronicles 26:6-10 King Uzziah fortifies clear to Egypt; he loves husbandry and builds towers in the desert.
2401. Second Chronicles 26:11-15 King Uzziah of Judah builds a three hundred seven thousand, five hundred man army; he makes ENGINES on towers to throw stones and arrows.
2402. Second Chronicles 26:16-20 King Uzziah violates the Temple, goes in to burn incense, God makes him a leper.
2403. Second Chronicles 26:21-23 King Uzziah is cut off from the Temple, his son runs the kingdom, Uzziah dies and is buried in a field.
2404. Second Chronicles 27:1-4 King Jotham, age twenty-five, reigns as new King of Judah for sixteen years; he builds castles in the mountains and cities.
2405. Second Chronicles 27:5-9 King Jotham is a good king; he defeats the Ammonites and is paid tribute by Ammon; he dies.
2406. Second Chronicles 28:1-5 King Ahaz, age twenty, reigns as new King of Judah for sixteen years; he is a bad king, makes idols, burned his children, and God gives him to Syria.
2407. Second Chronicles 28:5-8 King Ahaz and his army are then given to Israel; his sons and top men are slain, two hundred thousand women and children of Judah are taken captive to Israel.

2408. Second Chronicles 28:9-15 Prophet Oded confronts Israel for God; all Judah captives are returned home.
2409. Second Chronicles 28:16-21 The Edomites and Philistines attack King Ahaz of Judah; they call on Assyria for help but they refuse.
2410. Second Chronicles 28:22-27 King Ahaz is bad, brings in idols; God is mad and Ahaz dies but is not buried with the kings.
2411. Second Chronicles 29:1-11 King Hezekiah, age twenty-five, reigns as next king of Judah for twenty-nine years; he cleanses the Temple and Levites.
2412. Second Chronicles 29:12-36 The Temple is cleansed, offerings are made, there are big ceremonies, singing, and instruments played.
2413. Second Chronicles 30:1-10 King Hezekiah invites Israel and other tribes to Jerusalem for Passover which had been ignored for years; they laughed at him.
2414. Second Chronicles 30:11-27 Remnants of Israel, most still in Assyrian captivity, all come and do great sacrifices, do Passover; God blesses them.
2415. Second Chronicles 31:1-10 All idols are destroyed, Israel pays their tithe, all give to the Temple, and God blesses them.
2416. Second Chronicles 31:11-21 The Temple is prepared, tithes are brought, and priestly assignments are made by name.
2417. Second Chronicles 32:1-8 King Sennacherib of Assyria comes against Jerusalem; King Hezekiah shuts down the water and fortifies the city.
2418. Second Chronicles 32:9-19 King Sennacherib preaches doom to Judah and its allies; he says that God will not help them.
2419. Second Chronicles 32:20-23 King Hezekiah and Prophet Isaiah pray, God sends an angel who kills the Assyrian army, and King Sennacherib returns home to Syria where his sons kill him.

2420. Second Chronicles 32:24-29 King Hezekiah of Judah almost dies but God saves him; he is not good and builds riches.
2421. Second Chronicles 32:30-33 King Hezekiah brings water into the city of Jerusalem by viaduct; Babylon sends ambassadors; Hezekiah dies.
2422. Second Chronicles 33:1-5 King Manasseh, age twelve, reigns as new King of Judah for fifty-five years; he is very evil and builds pagan altars.
2423. Second Chronicles 33:6-10 King Manasseh's children are made to pass through the fire, he practices witchcraft and has wizards.
2424. Second Chronicles 33:11-13 The Assyrians take King Manasseh captive to Babylon (part of Assyria), he repents and God saves him.
2425. Second Chronicles 33:14-19 King Manasseh of Judah throws out the idols and repairs the Temple, but Judah still sins.
2426. Second Chronicles 33:20-25 King Manasseh dies and his son, Amon, age twenty-two, very evil, reigns as new King of Judah for two years; his servants kill him and are killed.
2427. Second Chronicles 34:1-7 King Josiah, age eight, reigns as new King of Judah for thirty-one years; he destroys the idols and kills and burns the Baal priests.
2428. Second Chronicles 34:8-13 King Josiah rebuilds the Temple; the Levites gather and bring money.
2429. Second Chronicles 34:14-33 Priest Hilkiyah finds the Book of the Law in the Temple and it scares everyone; he takes it to King Josiah who reads and responds to it.
2430. Second Chronicles 35:1-19 The Passover of King Josiah is the greatest since the days of Samuel; Levite duties.
2431. Second Chronicles 35:20-27 King Necho of Egypt wars against Carchemish of Euphrates area; King Josiah interferes, is wounded, and dies.

2432. Second Chronicles 36:1-3 King Jehohaz, age twenty-three, reigns as new King of Judah for three months, is overthrown by the King of Egypt and taken captive.
2433. Second Chronicles 36:4 King Necho of Egypt makes his brother, Elikim, King of Judah; his name is changed to Jehoiakim.
2434. Second Chronicles 36:5-8 King Jehoiakim, age twenty-five (Egyptian King of Judah) reigns eleven years; he is evil and King Nebuchadnezzar of Babylon takes him captive.
2435. Second Chronicles 36:9 King Jehoiachin, age eight, Egyptian son of King Jehoiakim, reigns for three months and ten days over Judah; he is evil.
2436. Second Chronicles 36:10 King Nebuchadnezzar of Babylon takes King Jehoichin, Egyptian King of Judah captive and makes his brother Zedekiah king (Babylonian King of Judah).
2437. Second Chronicles 36:11-12 King Zedekiah (Babylonian), age twenty-one, reigns for eleven years over Judah; he is evil and refuses to listen to Prophet Jeremiah's warnings.
2438. Second Chronicles 36:13-16 King Zedekiah rebels against King Nebuchadnezzar of Babylon, Assyria and totally rebels and mocks God.
2439. Second Chronicles 36:17-20 The King of the Chaldees (Babylon area) comes against Judah, slays the young men and maidens, takes the rest captive to Babylon, destroys the Temple, Jerusalem wall, and all vessels, and burns all of the rest of Jerusalem; it remains so until the reign of the King of Persia.
2440. Second Chronicles 36:21-22 King Cyrus of Persia takes the entire known world into his realm according to God's word to Prophet Jeremiah; King Cyrus says that God has charged him to rebuild the Temple in Jerusalem.
