

SECOND KINGS

2040. Second Kings 1:1 Moab attacks Israel after the death of Ahab when his son Ahaziah is king.
2041. Second Kings 1:2 King Ahaziah falls through a lattice at the palace in Samaria; he is sick unto death in bed.
2042. Second Kings 1:2-5 King Ahaziah sends an inquiry to Baal servants; they are stopped by Elijah and turned back.
2043. Second Kings 1:3-8 Prophet Elijah sends word that King Ahaziah will die; the messenger identifies Elijah as sending the message; Ahaziah is angry.
2044. Second Kings 1:9-10 King Ahaziah sends captains and fifty soldiers to Elijah who calls down fire from heaven and consumes them all.
2044. Second Kings 1:11-12 A second captain and fifty soldiers are sent and Elijah also calls down fire from heaven and consumes them also.
2046. Second Kings 1:13-14 A third captain and fifty soldiers are sent who come and fall down before Elijah and spared from the fiery death.
2047. Second Kings 1:15-18 Prophet Elijah goes to King Ahaziah with a message of death; he dies and Jehoram reigns as King of Israel.
2048. Second Kings 2:1-6 God is about to take Prophet Elijah; Elisha follows him to Bethel, Jericho, and to the Jordan River.
2049. Second Kings 2:7-8 Fifty prophets' sons watch as Elijah takes his mantle, winds it up, and strikes the Jordan River; the river parts.
2050. Second Kings 2:9-10 Elijah asks Elisha his desire; he asks for a double portion of Elijah's spirit; Elijah says yes, if Elisha sees him go up to heaven.

2051. Second Kings 2:11 A chariot of fire with horses of fire comes down and parts them; Elijah goes to heaven in a whirlwind.
2052. Second Kings 2:12-13 Elisha sees it and cries, “Chariot of Israel and Horsemen!” Elisha tears his clothes in two.
2053. Second Kings 2:14-15 New Prophet Elisha takes the mantle, strikes the Jordan River again; it parts and he crosses over; the other prophets witness it.
2054. Second Kings 2:16-18 Fifty prophets think Elijah landed on a mountain or in a valley; they search but don’t find him.
2055. Second Kings 2:19-22 Prophet Elisha is at Jericho; water there is poison; he salts and purifies it (heals the water).
2056. Second Kings 2:23-24 Elisha goes to Bethel and the children there call him “baldy.” He calls out two she bears and they kill all forty-two children.
2057. Second Kings 2:25 Prophet Elisha goes to Mt. Carmel and then to Samaria.
2058. Second Kings 3:1-5 Jehoram is King of Israel and Moab King Mesha is tired of the Israeli tariff and rebels against him.
2059. Second Kings 3:6-9 King Jehoram numbers Israel; he gets Kings of Judah and Edom to join him in war against rebellious Moab; on their way they all run out of water.
2060. Second Kings 3:10-14 King Jehoshaphat of Judah calls for Prophet Elisha, goes to him, and asks that he give them water.
2061. Second Kings 3:15-20 Prophet Elisha calls for a minstrel to play music; God tells them to make ditches, water will come, and they will destroy Moab.
2062. Second Kings 3:21-23 The Moabites see the water and think it is blood; they attack thinking Israel, Judah, and Edom have killed each other.

2063. Second Kings 3:24-25 Moab is defeated; their cities are beaten down, their wells filled, and their trees cut down.
2064. Second Kings 3:26-27 King Mesha of Moab is defeated and sacrifices his eldest son as a burnt offering; there is great hatred of Israel by everyone.
2065. Second Kings 4:1 A poor widow of a prophet comes to Elisha with word that her creditors are about to take her two sons for the debt.
2066. Second Kings 4:2-3 Elisha asks if she has anything of value; she tells him she has a pot of oil; he sends and borrows empty vessels from all of her neighbors.
2067. Second Kings 4:4-7 The widow fills all of the vessels from her pot, which never empties, sells the oil, redeems her sons, and with no debt, lives off the oil.
2068. Second Kings 4:8-14 A great woman of Shunem makes a chamber for Elisha to use as he comes by; he finds that she has no child.
2069. Second Kings 4:15-17 Elisha gets God to give the woman a child for payment for her goodness.
2070. Second Kings 4:18-20 The child is grown and goes to the field with his farmer father; he has a terrible headache and is taken to his mother; he dies on her lap.
2071. Second Kings 4:21-25 The woman lays her dead son on Elisha's bed and goes to Mt. Carmel, finds Elisha, and he sees her coming.
2072. Second Kings 4:26-28 The woman, a Shunammite, tells Elisha her son has died.
2073. Second Kings 4:29-32 Elisha sends his servant Gehazi ahead to lay his staff upon the dead young man.

2074. Second Kings 4:33-35 Elisha arrives with the mother; he lies upon the young man and warms his body; the young man sneezes seven times.
2075. Second Kings 4:36-37 Elisha calls the Shunammite woman and presents her son alive to her.
2076. Second Kings 4:38-39 Elisha comes to Gilgal; there is a dearth in the land, the sons of prophets are sitting hungry; Elisha tells Gehazi to put on the great pot and seethe pottage; one of the young men gathers herbs for the pot but they are poison.
2077. Second Kings 4:40-41 They all begin eating; there is poison (death) in the pot; they are alarmed but Elisha casts meal into the pot and purifies it.
2078. Second Kings 4:42-44 A man brings twenty loaves and some corn to them and Elisha multiplies it (same as Jesus); it feeds one hundred men and some is left over.
2079. Second Kings 5:1-4 Naaman, Captain of Syria is a leper; his captive Israeli maid tells him that a prophet in Israel can cure him.
2080. Second Kings 5:5-7 The Syrian King sends his Captain Naaman with goods to Israel's king who gets mad thinking it is a trick.
2081. Second Kings 5:8-10 Elisha sends for Naaman and sends a servant out of his house to tell Naaman to go wash in the Jordan River seven times.
2082. Second Kings 5:11-12 Naaman is offended, says that Damascus rivers are better, and leaves in a rage.
2083. Second Kings 5:13-14 Naaman's servants beg him, he dips seven times in the Jordan River, and is healed.
2084. Second Kings 5:15-19 Naaman offers payment to Elisha, which is refused; he asks a pardon for Syrian kings and his part in idol worship.

2085. Second Kings 5:20-27 Elisha's servant Gehazi goes after Naaman and asks for and takes gifts; he lies to Elisha and turns leprous along with his future seed.
2086. Second Kings 6:1-7 Israel's prophets want larger houses and begin to cut down trees for building; one of them who had borrowed an axe head loses it when it falls into the water; Elisha makes it swim and retrieves it.
2087. Second Kings 6:8-12 Syria's king wars against Israel; Elisha tells his Israeli king everywhere the enemy is located.
2088. Second Kings 6:13-18 The Syrian king finds Elisha at Dothan, surrounds it, ready to attack; God's army surrounds them and they are struck blind.
2089. Second Kings 6:19-23 Elisha leads the whole Syrian Army which is blind into Samaria, feeds them and sends them home to Syria.
2090. Second Kings 6:24-25 Syria's King Benhadad besieges Samaria, starvation sets in and a donkey's head and dove dung are sold for food.
2091. Second Kings 6:26-29 King Jehoram of Israel, in the besieged city is called by a starving woman who tells him of an agreement between her and a woman friend to eat their children; they had already eaten her child and the other woman had hidden her child, refusing to kill and eat him as agreed.
2092. Second Kings 6:30-33 King Jehoram of Israel wants Elisha's head for allowing the city of Samaria to starve.
2093. Second Kings 7:1-2 Elisha tells King Jehoram that food will be sold cheap on the next day in the gate of Samaria.
2094. Second Kings 7:3-5 Four lepers, starving outside the gate of Samaria, sneak into the Syrian camp for food and find that the Syrians have fled and left all of their belongings and food.

2095. Second Kings 7:6-7 God had made noises of attack upon the Syrians and they had fled in panic.
2096. Second Kings 7:8-10 The four lepers hid all of the Syrian loot they could, and afraid of day, they go and tell the Israeli king the Syrians are gone.
2097. Second Kings 7:11-16 King Jehoram sends out scouts as far as the river; Syrian garments are scattered all the way; food sells cheaply.
2098. Second Kings 7:17-20 The King's lord who doubted God, stands in the gate and is trampled to death by the people.
2099. Second Kings 8:1-2 Elisha tells the Shunammite woman to flee Israel; that there will be a seven-year famine.
2100. Second Kings 8:3-6 The Shunammite woman returns from seven years with the Philistines and begs the Israeli king to restore her house and land.
2101. Second Kings 8:7-10 Elisha is in Damascus; Syrian King Benhadad is sick and sends Hazael his servant to inquire of Elisha.
2102. Second Kings 8:11-13 Elisha tells Hazael that he will be king and will slaughter Israel and that King Benhadad will die.
2103. Second Kings 8:14-15 Hazael returns to Syria and tells King Benhadad that he will live, then puts a wet cloth over his face and kills him.
2104. Second Kings 8:16-19 King Jehoram reigns over Judah for thirty-two years; his wife is the daughter of King Ahab of Israel.
2105. Second Kings 9:1-3 Elisha sends a prophet son to Ramoth-Gilead to anoint Jehu King of Israel and to flee afterwards.
2106. Second Kings 9:4-6 The prophet son finds Captain Jehu in the army and anoints him King of Israel.

2107. Second Kings 9:7-9 King Jehu of Israel is told to destroy the whole House of Ahab for killing the prophets.
2108. Second Kings 9:10 A servant of Elisha (another prophet's son) tells Jehu that the dogs will eat Jezebel and then flees.
2109. Second Kings 9:11-16 King Jehu heads for Jezreel; Jehoram is wounded and the King of Judah visits him.
2110. Second Kings 9:17-20 A Jezreel watchman sees Jehu coming and sends two horsemen to meet him; neither returns.
2111. Second Kings 9:21-26 Jehoram (Israel) flees from Jehu and Jehu kills him with an arrow; he is cast into a field.
2112. Second Kings 9:27-29 Jehu chases and kills King Ahaziah of Judah who had fled to Megiddo and died; he is buried in Jerusalem.
2113. Second Kings 9:30-31 Jehu enters the gate of Jezreel; Jezebel makes herself up and stands in a window looking out.
2114. Second Kings 9:32-34 Jehu calls up some eunuchs there and had them throw her down, leaving blood on the wall; the horses trample her.
2115. Second Kings 9:35-36 Servants go to bury Jezebel but only her skull, feet, and palms of hands are left; the dogs had eaten her as prophesied.
2116. Second Kings 9:37 Jezebel remains as dung in a Jezreel field; there are no remains to see and identify ever.
2117. Second Kings 10:1-5 Jehu sends word to the "great men" who raised Ahab's seventy sons in Samaria and tells them to make one king; they refuse.
2118. Second Kings 10:6-7 Jehu's second message to Samaria is to behead all seventy sons and bring the heads in baskets to Jezreel; it is done.

2119. Second Kings 10:8-11 Jehu heaps the heads at the gate, then slays all who pertained to Ahab, including his priests, kin, great men, and all.
2120. Second Kings 10:12-14 Jehu intercepts forty-two men of Judah coming to honor the king and queen of Israel and slays them all.
2121. Second Kings 10:15-17 Jehu meets Jehonadab on the road, takes him with him to Samaria, and slays the remaining of Ahab's kin.
2122. Second Kings 10:18-28 Jehu tricks the Baal worshippers into an assembly, kills all of them, and burns their altars.
2123. Second Kings 10:29-31 God promises Jehu several generations of kings of Israel for his work, but he never departs from the sins of Jeroboam.
2124. Second Kings 10:32-36 Israel is incurred upon by her enemies; Jehu reigns for twenty-eight years, dies, and his son Jehoahaz is Israel's king.
2125. Second Kings 11:1 The mother of King Ahaziah of Judah, Athaliah, upon his death, kills his sons and assumes the throne. (Queen Athaliah)
2126. Second Kings 11:2-3 The sister of King Ahaziah saves one son, Joash from the murder and hides him and his nurse for six years.
2127. Second Kings 11:4-12 Judah priest Jehoiada, on the seventh year, takes Joash, guards him, and makes him King of Judah.
2128. Second Kings 11:13-16 Queen Athaliah hears the noise of the crowning of Joash; she cries, "treason." She is taken to the king's house and executed.
2129. Second Kings 11:17-21 Priest Jehoiada kills all of Baal priests in Judah; Jehoash begins to reign at age seven.
2130. Second Kings 12:1-2 King Jehoash reigned over Judah for forty years at Jerusalem instructed by Priest Jehoiada.

2131. Second Kings 12:3-16 The high places (idols) were not taken away but Jehoash tried to repair the House of The Lord.
2132. Second Kings 12:17-19 King Hazael of Syria comes against Judah but is paid off by Jehoash and returns to Syria.
2133. Second Kings 12:20-21 King Jehoash is murdered by his servants and his son, Amaziah, becomes King of Judah.
2134. Second Kings 13:1-2 Jehoahaz becomes King of Israel and reigns for seventeen years; he is very sinful.
2135. Second Kings 13:3-7 Israel is taken captive by Syrian kings Hazael and Benhadad his son; they repent and God releases them but they remain sinful.
2136. Second Kings 13:8-13 King Jehoahaz of Israel dies and Joash his son reigns over Israel for sixteen years and fights with Judah; after his death his son, Jeroboam II reigns.
2137. Second Kings 13:14-20 Prophet Elisha is on his deathbed; he has King Joash of Israel shoot arrows as a symbol of Syrian defeat, then he dies.
2138. Second Kings 13:20-21 Moab invades Israel; a man is buried accidentally in Elisha's sepulchre and revives.
2139. Second Kings 13:22-25 Syria continues to oppress Israel; for the sake of the early Patriarchs, God saves them and they regain their cities.
2140. Second Kings 14:1-5 Amaziah is King of Judah at age twenty-five and reigns for twenty-nine years; he keeps the high places (idols) and slays the servants who murdered his father.
2141. Second Kings 14:6 King Amaziah would not kill the children of his father's murderers because the Book of Law forbade it.
2142. Second Kings 14:7 King Amaziah slays ten thousand in Edom, takes Selah and renames it Joktheel.

2143. Second Kings 14:8-14 King Amaziah threatens Israel; King Jehoash and Israel win against Judah and tear down four hundred cubits of Jerusalem's wall.
2144. Second Kings 14:15-20 King Jehoash of Israel dies and Jeroboam II, his son reigns; King Amaziah of Judah is murdered in Lachish.
2145. Second Kings 14:21-23 Azariah, sixteen years old, is King of Judah; Jeroboam II is King of Israel and reigns for forty-one years.
2146. Second Kings 14:24-29 King Jeroboam II displeases God but recovers Damascus and Hamath from Judah; he dies and his son, Zachariah is King of Israel.
2147. Second Kings 15:1-4 King Azariah reigns for fifty-two years in Judah; he is a good king but kept the high places (idols).
2148. Second Kings 15:5-7 King Azariah becomes leprous and his son Jotham rules Judah; he (Azariah) dies and Jotham becomes king.
2149. Second Kings 15:8-9 King Zachariah reigns over Israel for six months and is very sinful.
2150. Second Kings 15:10-13 Shallum slays King Zachariah and becomes King of Israel in the thirty-ninth year of King Uzziah of Judah.
2151. Second Kings 15:14 Menahem from Tirzah goes to Samaria and slays King Shallum after one month and he becomes King of Israel.
2152. Second Kings 15:16 King Menahem smites the city of Tiphshah because they refused to open their gates to him; he also ripped up all pregnant women from there and along the coast.
2153. Second Kings 15:17 In the thirty-ninth year of Azariah (Uzziah-V13) King of Judah, Menahem reigns King of Israel for ten years.
2154. Second Kings 15:18-22 Assyria comes against Israel, Menahem buys them off; he dies and his son, Pekahiah reigns.

2155. Second Kings 15:23-27 Pekahiah, King of Israel, reigns for two years and is slain by Pekah who becomes king and reigns over Israel for twenty years.
2156. Second Kings 15:28-29 Assyria attacks Israel and takes their cities plus Gilead, Galilee, and Naphtau and carries them captive to Assyria.
2157. Second Kings 15:30-31 Hoshea, son of Elah, kills Pekah and reigns over Israel.
2158. Second Kings 15:32-36 Jotham, son of Uzziah is King of Judah at age twenty-five and reigns for sixteen years; he did well but kept the high places (idols).
2159. Second Kings 15:37-37 King Rezin (Syria) and King Pekah (Israel) fight with Judah; Jotham dies and his son Ahaz reigns over Judah.
2160. Second Kings 16:1-4 Judah's King Ahaz at age twenty reigns for sixteen years; was a good king at the beginning, then made his son pass through the fire and turned evil.
2161. Second Kings 16:5-9 King Ahaz sends to Assyria for help; Assyria's king takes Damascus and kills the Syrian king.
2162. Second Kings 16:10-18 King Ahaz has his Priest Urijah copy the altar of Damascus and build a matching one in Jerusalem.
2163. Second Kings 16:19-20 King Ahaz of Judah dies and his son Hezekiah becomes King of Judah.
2164. Second Kings 17:1-2 Hoshea becomes King of Israel for nine years and was an evil king.
2165. Second Kings 17:3-6 King Shalmaneser of Assyria takes Hoshea and Israel captive back to Assyria.
2166. Second Kings 17:7-18 A review of the sins of Israel since Egypt; now they are again in bondage.

2167. Second Kings 17:19-23 Judah is evil but Israel is worse; the prophets foretell that Israel will be taken from the “House of David.”
2168. Second Kings 17:24-25 The Assyrian King sends Assyrians from heathen areas to occupy Samaria; lions attack and kill some of them.
2169. Second Kings 17:26-28 The King of Assyria sends Israeli priests to teach God to Assyrians in Samaria.
2170. Second Kings 17:29-41 Nations occupying Samaria are so evil that they burn children, but Israelites are just as evil.
2171. Second Kings 18:1-3 King Hezekiah, age twenty-five, reigns in Judah at Jerusalem for twenty-nine years.
2172. Second Kings 18:4-5 King Hezekiah destroys all idols in Judah, even Moses’ brass serpent; he is the best king ever to reign over Judah.
2173. Second Kings 18:6-12 King Hezekiah of Judah rebels against Assyria and fights the Philistines; in his sixth year Israel is taken captive by Assyria.
2174. Second Kings 18:13-16 Assyria lays siege against Judah in Hezekiah’s fourteenth year; he gives them the silver and gold from the Temple.
2175. Second Kings 18:17-37 Assyrian envoys declare their power over Judah and say that Egypt will not come to Judah’s aid.
2176. Second Kings 19:1-5 Judah and Hezekiah are in sackcloth and ashes, afraid of Assyria; they come to Isaiah.
2177. Second Kings 19:6-13 Isaiah sends comfort to King Hezekiah; God intervenes and Libnah and Ethiopia begin fighting Assyria.
2178. Second Kings 19:14-19 King Hezekiah receives a letter from King Sennacherib of Assyria intending aggression; He prays to God.

2179. Second Kings 19:20-27 King Hezekiah goes to Isaiah again and receives word of God against Assyria.
2180. Second Kings 19:28 God's message to King Sennacherib of Assyria: "I will put a hook in your nose and a bridle in your lips and turn you back."
2181. Second Kings 19:29-34 God speaks to Judah and against Assyria, "Assyria will not attack Judah."
2182. Second Kings 19:35-36 God sends an angel and kills one hundred eighty-five thousand Assyrians; Sennacherib returns to Nineveh.
2183. Second Kings 19:37 King Sennacherib's two sons kill him while he is worshipping; his son Esar-haddon reigns over Assyria.
2184. Second Kings 20:1-3 Isaiah tells sick King Hezekiah that he will die; Hezekiah begs God to spare him, turns his face to the wall and cries.
2185. Second Kings 20:4-6 God tells Isaiah He heard Hezekiah's prayer and crying; He will give Hezekiah fifteen more years to live.
2186. Second Kings 20:7-8 Isaiah tells Hezekiah to put figs on the boil; Hezekiah asks for a sign that he will live.
2187. Second Kings 20:9-11 God gives a sign that King Hezekiah will live by backing up the sun ten degrees.
2188. Second Kings 20:12 King Berodachbaladan of Babylon sends a letter and presents because he hears that King Hezekiah is sick.
2189. Second Kings 20:13 King Hezekiah shows the Babylonian messengers all the jewels and wealth of Judah.
2190. Second Kings 20:14-17 Prophet Isaiah is angry with King Hezekiah for showing Judah's wealth and says that Babylon will carry all of the wealth of Judah away.

2191. Second Kings 20:18 Isaiah tells Hezekiah that all of his sons will be eunuchs in Babylon.
2192. Second Kings 20:19-21 King Hezekiah builds a pool and water conduit into Jerusalem; he dies and his son Manasseh reigns over Judah.
2193. Second Kings 21:1-9 King Manasseh, age twelve, reigns over Judah for twenty years; he is a terrible Baal and star worshipper.
2194. Second Kings 21:10-12 God condemns Jerusalem and Judah and says He will bring such evil upon them that their ears will tingle.
2195. Second Kings 21:13-14 God says He will destroy Jerusalem and make it a part of Samaria; Judah will go captive.
2196. Second Kings 21:15-16 God says that Judah has provoked Him since they left Egypt and that King Manasseh has shed innocent blood over Jerusalem.
2197. Second Kings 21:17-22 King Manasseh dies and his son, Amon, age twenty-two becomes King of Judah for two years; he does evil like his father.
2198. Second Kings 21:23-26 King Amon's servants kill him and they are killed; Josiah, Amon's son reigns as King of Judah.
2199. Second Kings 22:1-2 King Josiah, age eight, reigns over Judah for thirty-one years; he is a good king like King David.
2200. Second Kings 22:3-4 King Josiah sends his Scribe Shaphan to Priest Hilkiah and orders Hilkiah to take money from the treasury to repair the Temple.
2201. Second Kings 22:5-7 The builders repair the Temple faithfully and deal honestly with the money spent.
2202. Second Kings 22:8-10 Priest Hilkiah finds the Book of the Law in the Temple, Scribe Shaphan reads it and takes it to the King.

2203. Second Kings 22:11-13 King Josiah is alarmed at the laws in the book which have been broken; he sends Priest Hilkiah, Scribe Shaphan, and two young men to a prophetess.
2204. Second Kings 22:14 The King's delegation goes to Prophetess Huldah; she dwells at the College in Jerusalem.
2205. Second Kings 22:15-17 Prophetess Huldah sends word to King Josiah that evil from God will come upon Judah for not heeding the Book of the Law.
2206. Second Kings 22:18-20 Prophetess Huldah tells King Josiah that because he is humble, the evil will come after his reign.
2207. Second Kings 23:1-3 King Josiah calls Judah elders and Jerusalem to the Temple and reads the covenant from the Book of the Law.
2208. Second Kings 23:4-5 King Josiah destroys all idols to Baal, sun, moon, planets, and stars and rids Judah of Baal priests.
2209. Second Kings 23:6-12 Josiah destroys the houses of Sodomites; the high place priests refuse to relent.
2210. Second Kings 23:13 King Josiah of Judah destroys all of King Solomon's idols on the Mt. of Corruption.
2211. Second Kings 23:14-19 Josiah destroys all graveyards of heathens but spares the sepulchre of God's prophets.
2212. Second Kings 23:20 King Josiah kills all heathen priests and burns their bones.
2213. Second Kings 23:21-23 King Josiah has The Passover observed in his eighteenth year; it had not been observed since the time of the Judges.
2214. Second Kings 23:24-25 King Josiah cleanses Judah; never had a king turned so completely to God before or after him.

2215. Second Kings 23:26-28 God still condemns Judah, like Israel, to captivity for previous sins against Him.
2216. Second Kings 23:29 Pharaoh Nechoh of Egypt goes against Assyria to the Euphrates River; King Josiah is against him and is killed at Megiddo.
2217. Second Kings 23:30 King Josiah's body is carried back to Jerusalem and buried; his son, Jehoahaz becomes King of Judah.
2218. Second Kings 23:31-33 King Jehoahaz of Judah is twenty-three years old and reigns for three months; he is evil and Egypt takes him and places a tax of tribute on Judah.
2219. Second Kings 23:34 Egypt's Pharaoh makes Eliakim, son of Josiah king and changes his name to Jehoiaquim; Jehoahaz dies in Egypt.
2220. Second Kings 23:35-37 King Jehoiaquim (spelling changed) is age twenty-five and reigns eleven years over Judah; he is evil and pays taxes to Pharaoh of Egypt.
2221. Second Kings 24:1 Babylon's King Nebuchadnezzar takes Judah; King Jehoiaquim serves him but rebels.
2222. Second Kings 24:2-4 God sends the Chaldees, Syrians, Moabites, and Ammonites to destroy Judah because of the sins of Manasseh.
2223. Second Kings 24:5-6 King Jehoiaquim dies and his son, Jehoiachin is crowned King of Judah.
2224. Second Kings 24:7 Egypt is expelled from Judah and Babylonian King Nebuchadnezzar rules all land between the Nile and Euphrates rivers.
2225. Second Kings 24:8-12 King Jehoiachin is King of Judah at age eighteen and reigns for only three months; he is evil and Babylon takes him, his mother, servants, and princes captive to Babylon.

2226. Second Kings 24:13-16 Babylon takes Solomon's treasures, craftsmen, and ten thousand men of valor and leaves only the poor in Judah.
2227. Second Kings 24:17-20 Zedekiah, uncle of the King of Babylon (his father's young brother) at age twenty-one is made King of Judah and reigns for eleven years; he is evil and rebels against Babylon.
2228. Second Kings 25:1-3 King Nebuchadnezzar of Babylon lays siege on Jerusalem and there is a four-month famine in the city.
2229. Second Kings 25:4-7 King Zedekiah escapes but is caught; his sons are killed in front of him, his eyes are put out, and he is carried to Babylon.
2230. Second Kings 25:8-10 Babylon's Captain of the Guard Nebuzar-adan tears down the Jerusalem wall and burns the temple and the king's house.
2231. Second Kings 25:11-12 The rest of Judah is carried captive to Babylon except the vinedressers and husbandmen.
2232. Second Kings 25:13-17 Babylon takes all Temple instruments, pillars, metal, etc.
2233. Second Kings 25:18-21 Judah's Chief Priest Seraiah, Priest Zephaniah, scribe, three keepers of the door, and those found remaining are taken to Babylon and slain.
2234. Second Kings 25:22 King Nebuchadnezzar makes Gedaliah ruler of Judah.
2235. Second Kings 25:23-24 Scattered army captains of Judah come to Gedaliah; he tells them to serve Babylon and live well.
2236. Second Kings 25:25 Ishmael, son of Judah seed royal kills Gedaliah and the Jews and Chaldees left with him.
2237. Second Kings 25:26 All Judah captains flee to Egypt to escape the Chaldees of Babylon.

2238. Second Kings 25:27 After thirteen years captive in Babylon, King Jehoiachin of Judah is released from prison.
2239. Second Kings 25:28-30 Evil-merodach, new King of Babylon gives Jehoiachin a throne higher than any other sub-king in Babylon and he is given a daily allowance the rest of his life.
